

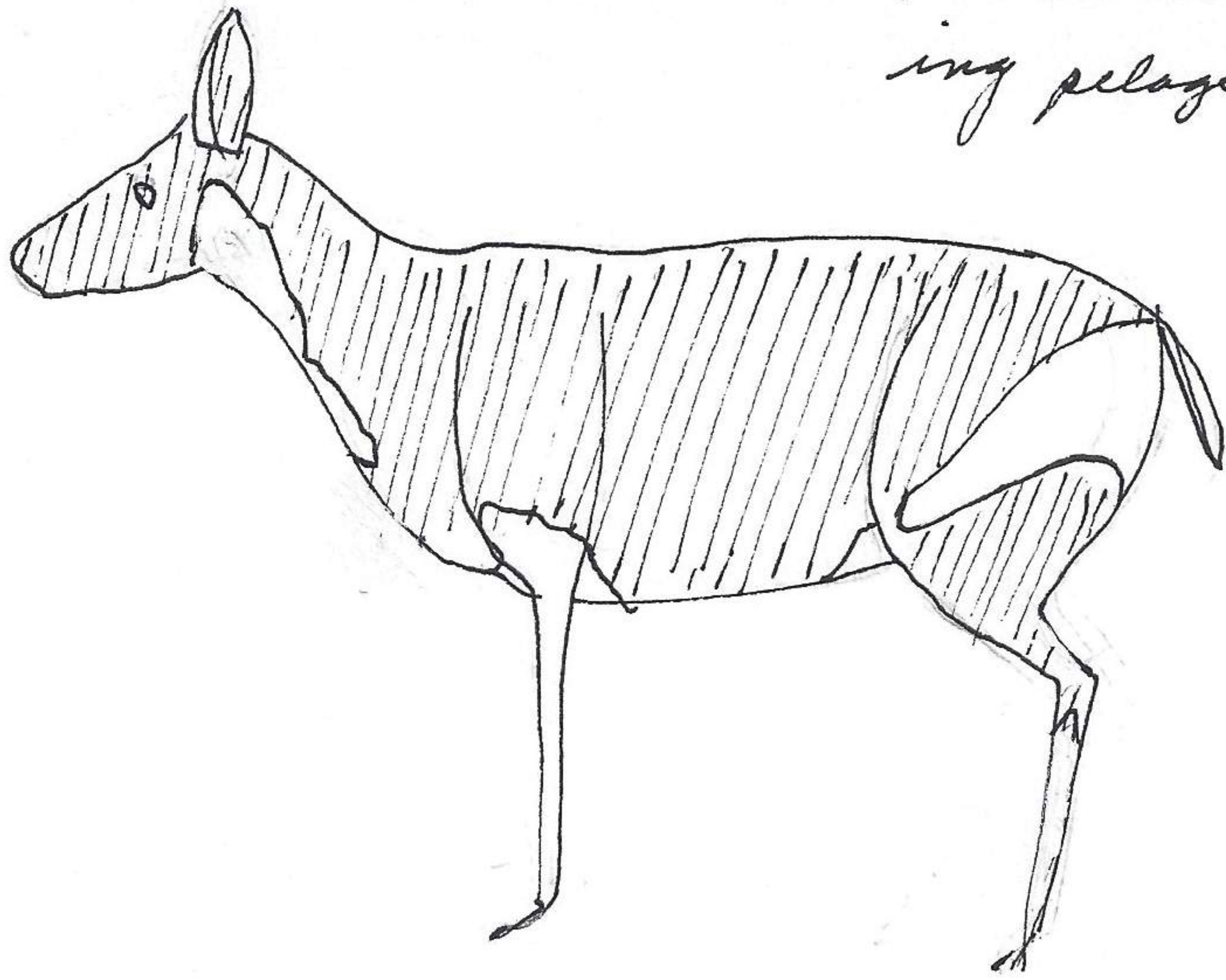


Buster, an adult female mule deer showing pelage change from summer  to winter .



9:28 A.M. 5 river otter in close grouping swim NE past Bee House. many references in journal report direction as N or S but a critical direction is NE and SW. and should be so interpreted.

12:08 P.M. red-tailed hawk flew SW past Bee House at approx. 100' above house. no glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island.

12:10 A.M. On Leo Reef are: 25 cormorants, 17 harbor seal and 2 glaucous-winged gulls.

Deciduous trees on W side Blakely Island (directly E of Bee House), are turning color; mostly yellowish-green, 30% red and 6 trees bright yellow.

Sept. 24, 1988

10:00 A.M. 51 cormorants, 27 harbor seal and 6 glaucous-winged gulls on Leo Reef. (light rocks). Also 1 harbor seal on Leo Reef Rock no. 10, 2 harbor seal on Little Flower Island Rock and 2 glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island.

10:20 A.M. an adult ♀ mule deer, 29" high at shoulders fed from hand for first time. Pelage all winter hair.

Sept. 26, 1988

10:20 A.M. 18 harbor seal, 22 cormorants and 6 glaucous-winged on Leo Reef

Left on The Bee (boat) 12:00 P.M., circled Obstruction Island via Peavme and Obstruction passes, thence Olga and return to Shoal Bay anchorage. 18 harbor seal on Spindle Rocks. Temp. in boat since last used max 114°F min 49°F
