This is end of complete census as return from here same as original route earlier on trip.

At NW end Humphrey Head, 81 pelagic cormorants on cliff in white-wash area. 12 of them flew out to participate in fishing group of gulls & cormorants.

Back to starting point at S end Shast Bay anchorage at 5:50 P.M. at haul meter 2628. Trip 3 hrs 20 min.

Oct 14, 1988

8:35 A.M. smallest mule deer in area of Bee Estate 25 1/2" high at shoulders

The male mule deer with recurved antlers approached feeder at Bee House with 5 ♀'s (2 ad + 3 young) and fed amicably for 2 minutes then gradually displaced all females out to beyond 20' one at a time, by probing with head and forceful strike with front feet. One young of the year returned to the feeder but in each case was forced away by striking feet of ♂. One of the tactics is to place nose on ♀ body and give the head an upthrust. One spike buck and an adult female were observed to chase an eastern gray squirrel for 20'; the female in this case. The ♂ on two occasions chased 2 common crows, again for about 20'.
