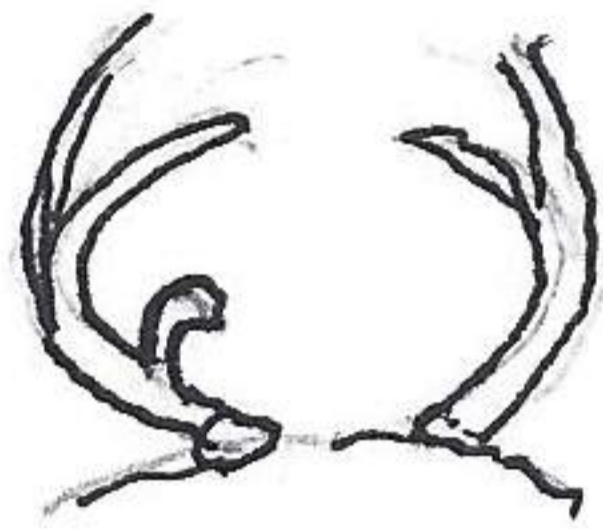
The house finch has increased in the last 2 weeks at the Bee House feeder and now are regular daily visitors averaging 11 at the feeder (2-15).

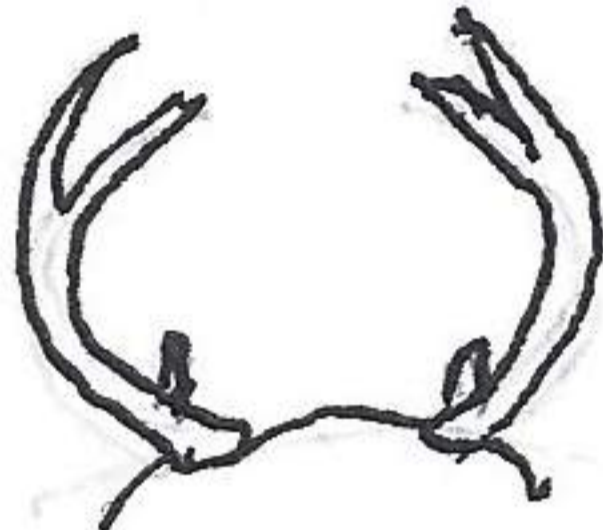
9:30 A.M. Harbor seal remained under water for 2 min and 10 seconds.

Oct. 21, 1988

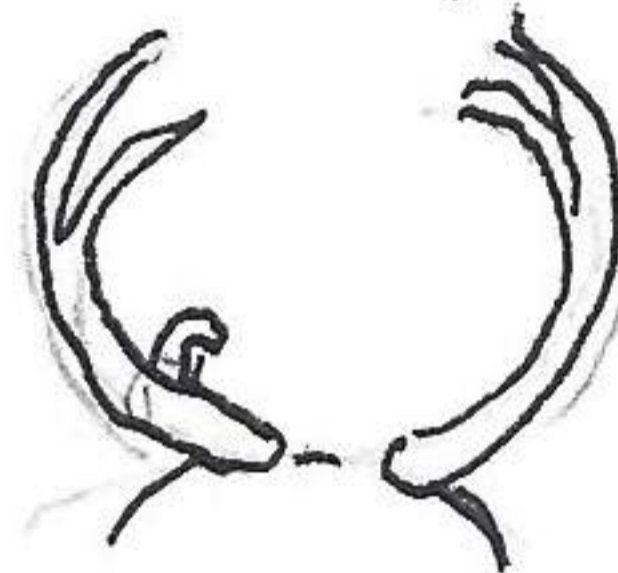
7:45 A.M. 3 male mule deer at feeder but never more than 2 at the feeder at the same time. They are:



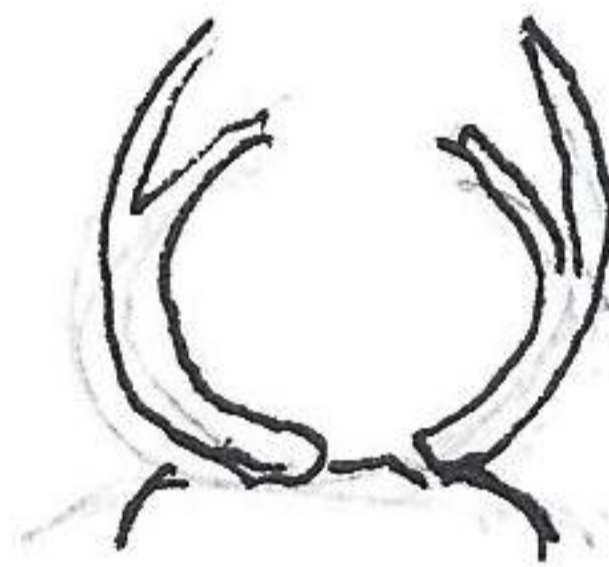

2:30 PM 8 Bonaparte and 6 glaucous-winged gulls fed together in close association in center of Spring Cove, capturing mmmaws. Two minutes later a single double-crested cormorant arrived but gulls had already partially abandoned close group formation. The cormorant fed one minute then moved 200' along shoreline and started another fishing spot. A pelagic cormorant joined it and then all gulls of the preliminary fishing spot in Spring Cove joined the 2 cormorants. A rhinoceros auklet arrived but fed on the peripheral area of main fishing spot. The gulls and cormorants fished this new area for approx. 3 minutes.

Trip to Anacortes by ferry. Left Lopez and will keep only kinds of birds observed or exceptional noteworthy observations: 1 ad bald eagle top dead tree at west end Thatcher Pass on Blakely Island along shore. Glaucous-winged gull, Bonaparte gull, mew gull, double-crested cormorant, common murre. In the middle of Rosario Straits
