3:35 A.M. ad. bald eagle flew N along shoreline approx. 50' above water to Spring Cove, then abruptly reversed direction and alighted in Douglas tree above Dissection Point.

Townsend chipmunk still active.

Eastern gray squirrel with cut ears at feeder.

3:20 P.M. ad. bald eagle on Leo Reef Beacon.

Dec. 7, 1988

7:24 A.M. ad. bald eagle flew to S past Bee House

10:20 A.M. 6 common mergansers fed vigorously in Spring Cove for 1 minute, then all left abruptly by flight.

Dec 8, 1988

Townsend Chipmunks are active today. I can not recall that I have not seen them active every day of the summer and fall.
