made trip across foot hills from State mental to first canyon north of rock Canyon. Observed a few *Cnemidophorus* near mouth of Rock Canyon. Trip ended with Jack, my dog, breaking his leg. Improvised splints and when arriving at home set leg. at a point below mouth of this last mentioned canyon observed a weasel run across the road about 2:30 P.M. (see notes of some day beyond in book)

*Mephitis* collected on this day (see notes) measured, 23 1/2 inches in length, 10 3/4 inches tail, 2 13/16 inches foot, no. (87438 J.B.). Also no. (1187638 J.B.) measured, 14 1/2 inches length, 2 1/4 tail, 4 inches foot.

made trip up Spanish Fork Canyon to investigate *Eutamias d. utahensis*. First canyon at about 1 mile down canyon from a point where Diamond Fork and Spanish Fork converge and about the 2nd small canyon up canyon from Castella. Passed up this canyon to rock slide hence up west side hill to top of cliffs and then to highway again. Heard only one *Eutamias* at top of ridge. About 20 minutes before twilight. This canyon should supply several different species because of the varied habitat.

made second trip up Diamond Fork Canyon to the same site as of 9-30/38. In the field from 8:00 A.M. to 12:30 P.M. This canyon can be readily told by the numerous rock outcroppings with honeycombed sections. A large rock slide near forks about 2 blocks
