1:45 Swift Lagoon: 18 mallards, 7 godwits.
Two bald eagle sightings so far today.

Feb. 2, 1990

2:35 P.M. 12 harbor seals on Leo Reef.
Swift Bay Low Beach. 215 American crows in loose
groups on beach.
No birds on Hummel Lake, Swift Lagoon or Humphrey
Lagoon. misty rain all day.

Feb. 3, 1990

4:00 P.M. 26 harbor seal on Leo Reef.
4:12 P.M. 1 river otter swam 5 paces Bee House. Tide
low and otter following edge of water at body depth.
4:25 P.M. Ad. bald eagle flew from Bee House directly E
to Blakely Island, thence N $\frac{1}{10}$ mile, thence S along
shoreline at approx. 500', across Thatcher Bay and S.
Fisherman Bay Causeway, San Juan Channel side out
approx to 200'. 18 bufflehead, 2 group (8;4) surf scoters,
6 scoup ? sp., 5 glaucous-winged gulls, 6 mewgulls, 7 Am-
erican crows. On E side Causeway in Bay, a continuat-
ion S of Fisherman's Bay: 13 scoup, 3 great blue heron, 240
mew gulls, 23 glaucous-winged gulls, 4 buffleheads, 1
double-crested cormorant, 2 red-breasted mergansers, 9
American crows, 9 black-bellied plover, 16 western sand-
pipers. The glaucous-winged gulls were generally distributed
and searching tidal flats. The mew congregated on area.
no birds Swift Lagoon, or Humphrey Lagoon.
Wind last night approx. 60 M.P.H. Bee driveway with Doug-
las fir branches 4" to 2" every foot apart. One main road
in front Bee Estate road clean. Wind blew 9 shingles off
Bee House.

In front Bee House at 2:40 P.M. 53 mew gulls searching
