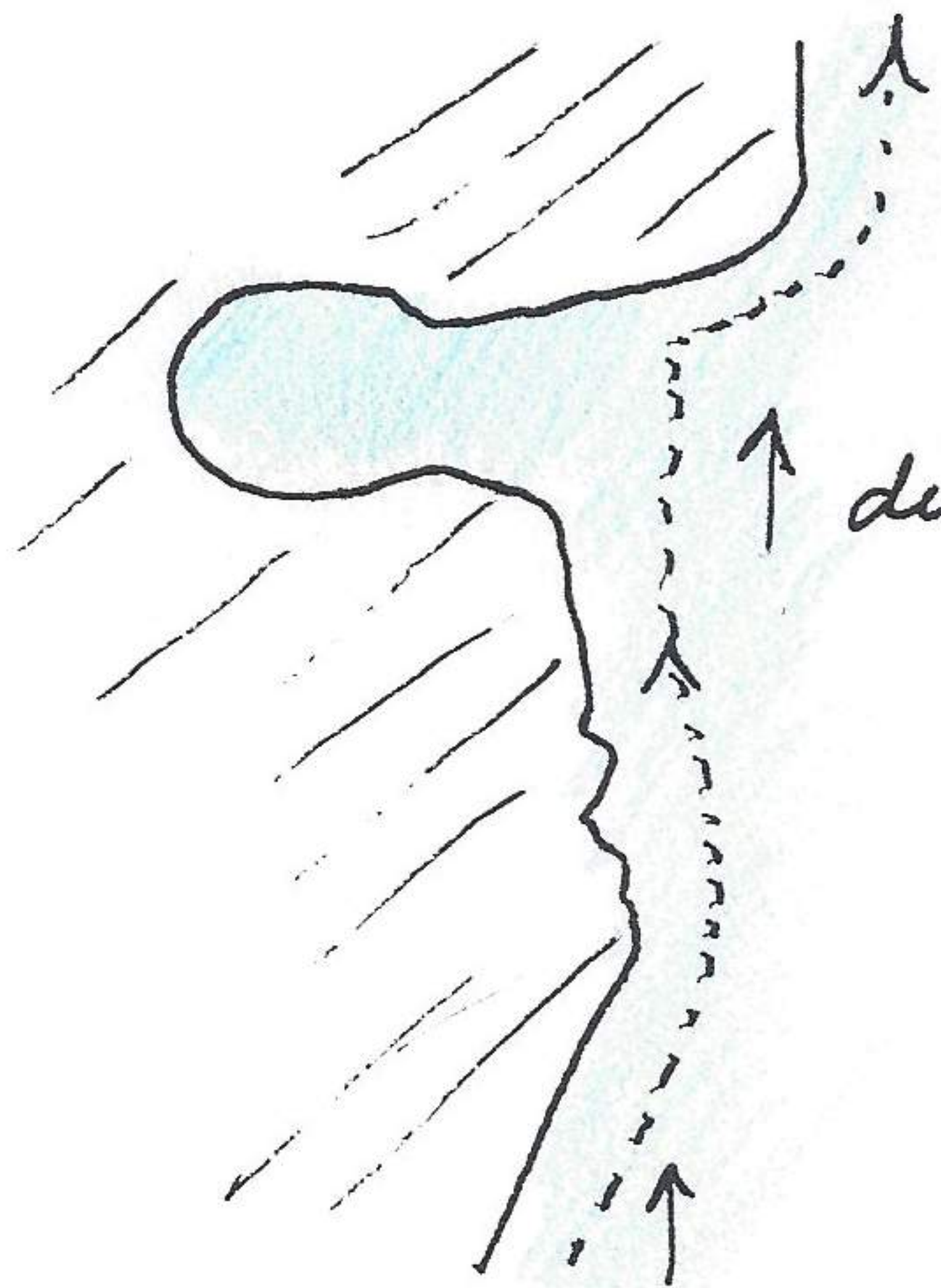


albino feathers

3:10 P.M. Strong winds from S, no harbor seal Les Reef.

Stream of foam 25' or so from shore and moving N.

5:30 P.M. approaching twilight. No harbor seals on any put-out in sound. (N Lopez Sound).

Feb. 5, 1990

Left for Anacortes 10:05 A.M. 2 adult bald eagles flew west at Lopez Island ferry terminal. Wind SE and waves, <sup>white caps</sup>. At least 80 mew gulls N end Humphrey Head, 8 pelagic cormorants. Floating logs have mew gulls, one with 25, pelagic cormorant, 2 mew gulls, pelagic cormorant. On Blakely hillsides in open proximal areas are bright green. Willow Island, W Thatcher Pass. Glaucous-winged gull, 2 mew gulls, pelagic cormorant. No gulls on Pointer Islands and all green. 4 pelagic cormorant, mew gull. Arrive Anacortes. Camped at Thousand Trail Camp.

9:15 P.M. Thunder. Thunder has also been heard on Lopez Island last 3 nights.

8:10 A.M. 3rd year bald eagle circled Lone Tree Peninsula, thence NE up coastline of bay.

6 Glaucous-winged gull, 5 bufflehead in Lone Tree Lagoon.

Birds in area: 11 black oystercatchers remained on shore S of Lone Tree Point and bathed in high wind and cold temperature, 8 black turnstones, 6 surfbirds, 8 western sandpipers (all three <sup>am.</sup> above species in one group), 52 American crows remained in causeway area and on an
