

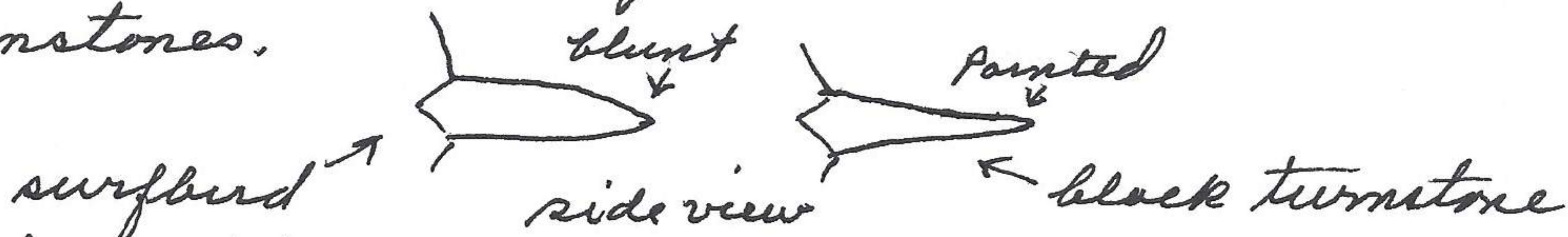
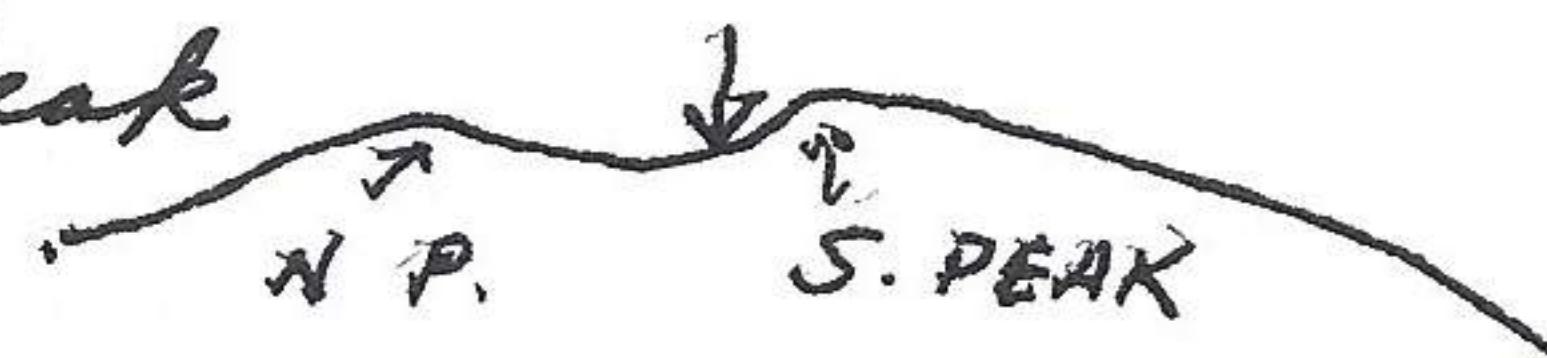
5:47 P.M. 21 new galls, 4 of which are subadults, fished or fed 20'-80' in front Bee House.

6:05 ad. bald eagle flew past Bee House in rain and poor visibility. It passed 15' from bedroom window

Feb. 22, 1990

Sunrise 7:27 AM at base of S Thatcher Peak

9:30 A.M. In front Bee House on rock shoreline observed 3 surfbirds and 5 black turnstones.



Surfbirds leg - solid yellow and bright.

black turnstone leg - reddish and transparent.

Both species displace each other but black turnstone more so. Surf bird larger than black turnstone. They remained in area for 20 minutes in front Bee House.

2:00 P.M. An adult bald eagle on Leo Reef and within 4 feet to the nearest of 25 harbor seal. The eagle hopped to other rocks but did not disturb the seal.

4:45 P.M. 2 adult bald eagles fed on a carcass of some kind for 35 minutes among 21 harbor seal. One seal was 8 feet of eagles.

Incoming American Crows (21) flew ^{25' high} over surfbirds and black turnstone without disturbing the shorebirds.

American crows when feeding on rocky slopes where cracked corn is broadcasted for other birds, remove or turn over rocks up to 3" in diameter to get at the food lodged under the rocks.

Feb. 23, 1990

In N Lopez Sound in an area between Leo Reef, Lower Island and Bee House at 2:00 P.M.; 1 pelagic cormorant, 1 surf scoter, 1 marbled murrelet, ^{and} 1 glaucous-winged gull. Day clear and water calm.

Collected the 2 following insects at Bee House:

900223-1 wood boring beetle

900223-2 ant.

Feb. 24, 1990

10:30 A.M. Fog lifted from N Lopez Sound. No harbor seal Leo Reef.
