Fork Canyon and with an uninterrupted course, ski practically to the Honor Hike Camp Base at the head of the Grove Creek Canyon Proper, a distance requiring a full day to traverse ascending but requiring only minutes to descend. The best and fortunate feature about this course is the fact that the dangers of snowslides are practically eliminated, but a course paralleling the greatest mountain in Utah which from its steep and perpendicular slopes experiences snowslides and avalanches practically every hour of the day. To enjoy the utmost pleasure of skiing in safety and at the same moment have a reserved seat to observe the natural phenomena of a snowslide is a combination not very seldom duplicated. Left at 2:30 P.M. and arrived at Honor Hike Camp at 3:20 P.M. after drying water soaked socks, shoes and rubbers of a couple of the members of the party left at 4:05 for car. Spring at 4:23 and car at 4:54. Sun had just dropped below the ridge of west mountains on our arrival at the car. It now remains for the selected group of Honor Hikers to regain this plateau when the rigors of old. Man winter are more in evidence than experienced today, and at a time of year when the only possible approach to this area will be with the aid of snow shoes and skis and equipment sufficient to camp out for one or two nights.

Collected mollusca today in Preference Spring. This spring which is located ^{north} west of town along the Provo River is not recorded upon any available maps so a temporary name has been given to it. As to location one will gain its course by following ^{west on} 5th north to a point where rock crusher can be seen along banks of river. From the crusher one can see a swinging bridge across river to the west. It is ~~from~~ ^{from} the north end of this bridge that specific direction can be given as to its exact whereabouts. If one travels N.W. from here he is sure to intercept spring course in about 100' or less. The spring course before it enters into the main creek is only about 80' long. The main spring creek and Provo River ^{are} parallel and this intervening space is occupied by this Preference spring which receives its name, ~~not~~ in lieu of the fact that it preferred to enter the creek course rather than directly into the Provo river to the south. Invasions into the head of this spring could be by the Provo River, main creek which issues farther up river bottom, or from artificial canal which brings water from the main large springs that issue from the ^{base and} edges of the
