

few birds there are of any size along highways. At 3:04 P.M. in an inundated field to S are approx 1000 mallards, 30 gadwalls, 50 American widgeons and one Trumpeters swan. There may have been other species of ducks. This area is approx. 4 mi. E Hamelton on highway 20. There are other flooded fields and all have ducks. I would estimate 5000 in all. No Burlington, thence mt. Vernon, to Lacanor Thousand Trails Preserve.

March 13, 1990

Left Thousand Trails Preserve at La Conner at 10:26 A.M. for Anacortes Ferry Terminal. Left for Lopez Island 10:51 A.M. Clouds 15%, wind SE. Surf seater. marine light SW Cypress Island. Pigeon guillemot, double-crested cormorant, mew gull, 5 Pointer Island. Approx 70 glaucous-winged gulls on ^{visible} S face island and on territories. Lawson Reef. 28 mew gulls, 1 glaucous-winged gull, 1 double-crested cormorant. W end Thatcher Pass at light. 80% sand slope stabilized with greenish-gray moss. Glaucous-winged gull. Willow Island. Water falls (named here as Thatcher Water Falls) with normal amount of water for this time & season. Log piled on ramp at N end Bay. 14 harbor seal on Leo Reef. Arrived Lopez Island 11:29 A.M. Home on Humphrey Head 11:40 A.M.

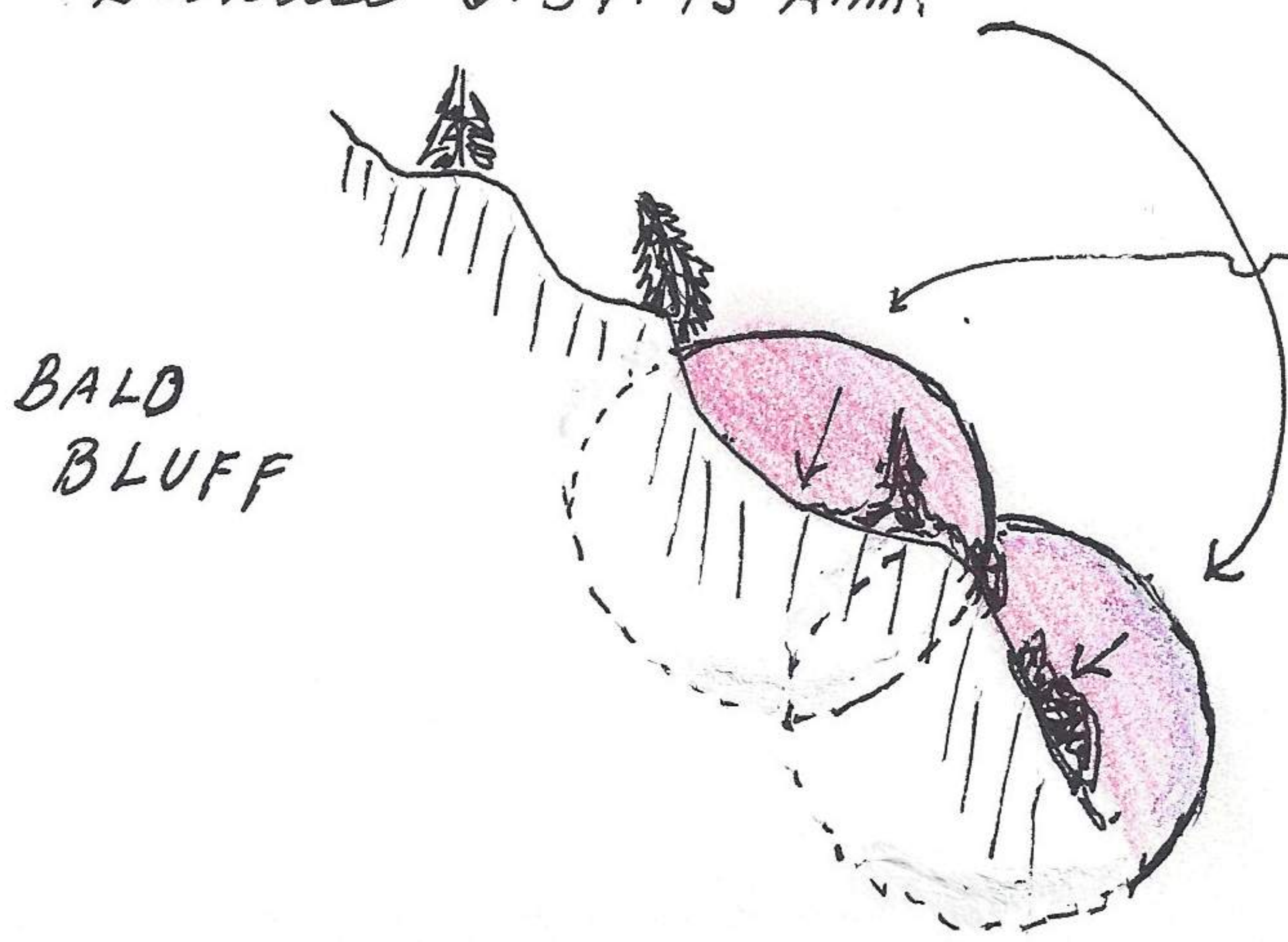
1:30 P.M. a belted kingfisher perched on limb above Spring Cove raised in unison head, body & tail every 10 seconds for 6 consecutive times.
