mule deer at feeder at Bee House: ♂ 29" high at shoulders


3"  $\Delta \Delta^2$ " in velvet, ♀ with 3 fawns but one adaped.

8:30 AM River otter swam N past Bee House 10' out from shore. Placed the Bee boat, Grand Banks, at moorage in Shoal Bay, wintered at Shoal Bay Marina. River on S end of Shoal Bay dock (at marina) and left to S. Osprey flew full length N in Shoal Bay, then returned to S end where it caught a 4" fish.

May 11, 1990

2:05 PM bald eagle, black terminal on white tail. Head:



The dead harbor seal (May 8, 1990) on Flat Point. S of Spring Cove visited by 2 ad. bald eagles this P.M. One of the eagles took 24 bites per minute after settling in on feeding. The

other averaged 4 bites then stood upright to survey area, then back to feeding for 4 or so more bites. Common roven averaged 40 bites per minute per individual with less upright stance. Seals head, neck and ribs now exposed. One of the 2 eagles fed for 1/2 hour then moved 6' away to a log and after 10 minutes left.

5:10 P.M. 2 turkey vultures feeding on above dead seal.

May 12, 1990

A ♂ mule deer with 1" antlers 29" high at shoulders.

8:00 A.M. common roven at harbor seal corps of above.

mule deer refuse asparagus.

1:40 P.M. Harbor seal (34) on Les Reef.
