




Observed 6 gold finches along Baker View Road and at Part Stanley. These birds are frequently observed (1/2 trips to Lopez Village) on the more open areas of the island.

May 15, 1990

This A.M. via ferry to Friday Harbor via Crane Passage and return by Upright Head. Birds observed: rhinoceros auklets, glaucous-winged gulls, turkey vultures, kingfisher, double-crested cormorants, pigeon guillemots, pelagic cormorants.

May 16, 1990

at feed at Bee House at 7:30 A.M. a mule deer fawn; ♂  33 1/2" high at shoulders; ♂  34" high at shoulders;

♀ last year  summer pelage; last year ♂ 29" high at shoulders 2 ♀ and 34" high shoulders ♂ eating new needles of Douglas fir.

Trip by ferry to Orcas Island. At E side airport there, a bald eagle circled 5 times, gaining altitude then soared straight N. Returned to Lopez. Redtail hawk junction Hummel and Center roads.

May 17, 1990

7:30 A.M. 2 fawn mule deer at feeder. no adults present. Bald eagle facing E on nest NE Frost Island. 16 harbor seal on Leo Reef.
