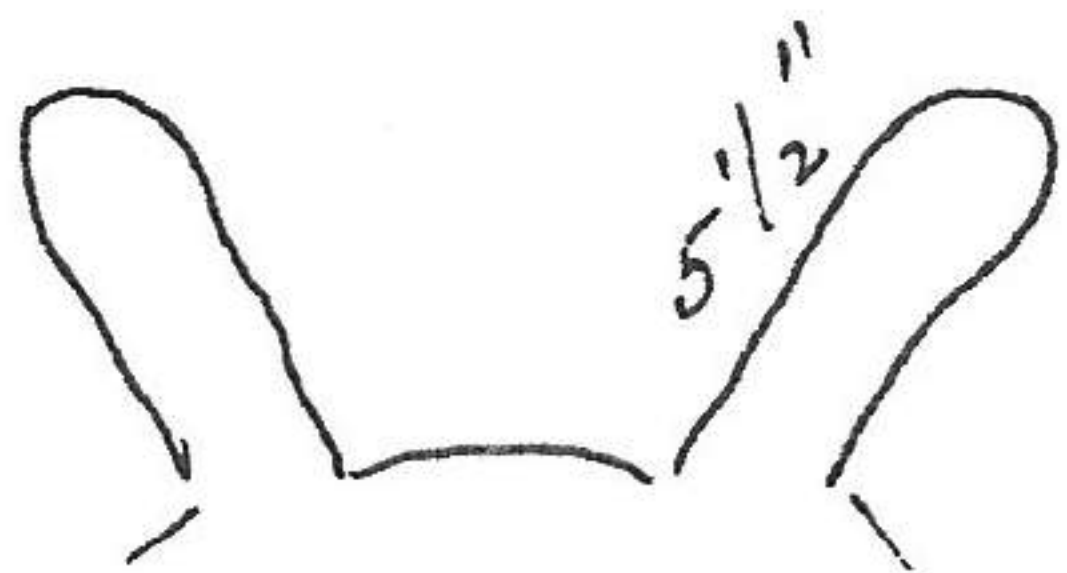


a band-tailed pigeon, the crow is dominant but a single crow in a flock of pigeons, the crow is subordinate.

♂ mule deer 34" high at shoulders. This male mule deer was curious and shyed away from a new born fawn.



This ♂ mule deer measuring 33" high at shoulder kicked with its front feet, a new born fawn. I have never observed a mule deer using its rear legs

for this or any other defensive purpose. At feeder were also ♀ mule deer 30" high at shoulders and another ♀ new to area 31" high at shoulders. Fawns are curious about ^Egray ~~gray~~ and chipmunks (Townsend). Last year ♀ timid of fawn.

7:05-7:30 P.M. Ad. bald eagle on cup of nest facing N. (NE Frost Island). 7:30 P.M. second adult bald eagle arrived from N and fed young for 5 minutes. The first eagle left nest 2 minutes after 2nd eagle arrived with food. After above 5 minute feeding it moved to SE edge of nest and remained for 20 minutes, then returned to cup and fed young for 6 minutes, then to edge of nest again where it remained to at least 8:10 P.M. at which time the evening lights were fading and I discontinued observation.

May 23, 1990
