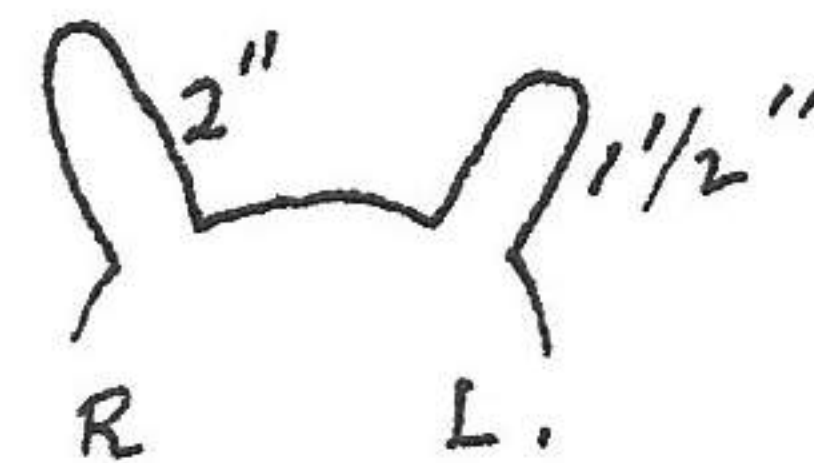


no birds at least to Point Farranteray. First birds, beacon, SW Cypress Island

 Arrived Anacortes: thence Burlington + return. Left Anacortes for
 Lopez Island at 4:20 P.M. via ferry.

May 24, 1990

at Swifts Lagoon this A.M.: 68 mallards, 11 gadwalls, 4 ♂ common teal. These ducks were in one close group in contrast to the usual general distribution.

at Bee House ♂ mule deer 29" high at shoulders
 another ♂ 26" high at shoulders with antlers just budding



May 27, 1990

at causeway SW end Fishermans Bay on Lopez Island observed the following on W side (San Juan Channel) 18 glaucous-winged gulls, 2 buffleheads, 16 great blue herons, 9 American crows. at approximately 200' W of shoreline a raft of debris of indeterminate N-S length. On E side causeway. 8 glaucous-winged gulls and 7 great blue herons.

May 28, 1990

Last 3 days bald eagles absent from nest on NE end Frost Island in late evening but present after sundown.

Last 4 days ♀ ^{adult} mule deer eating new growth of Douglas fir on Bee Estate.

May 29, 1990

To Anacortes. ^{bold} No eagle nest in tree N end Humphrey Head. Open slopes above rocky shoreline on E side are grayish brown. 16 harbor seal on N side Leo Reef and 1 cormorant. 2 glaucous-winged gulls SW end Blakely Island. Usual gulls on Pomter Island. In Rosario Strait, glaucous-winged gull, Anacortes and return to Lopez Island. A ♂ mule deer at Bee House:
