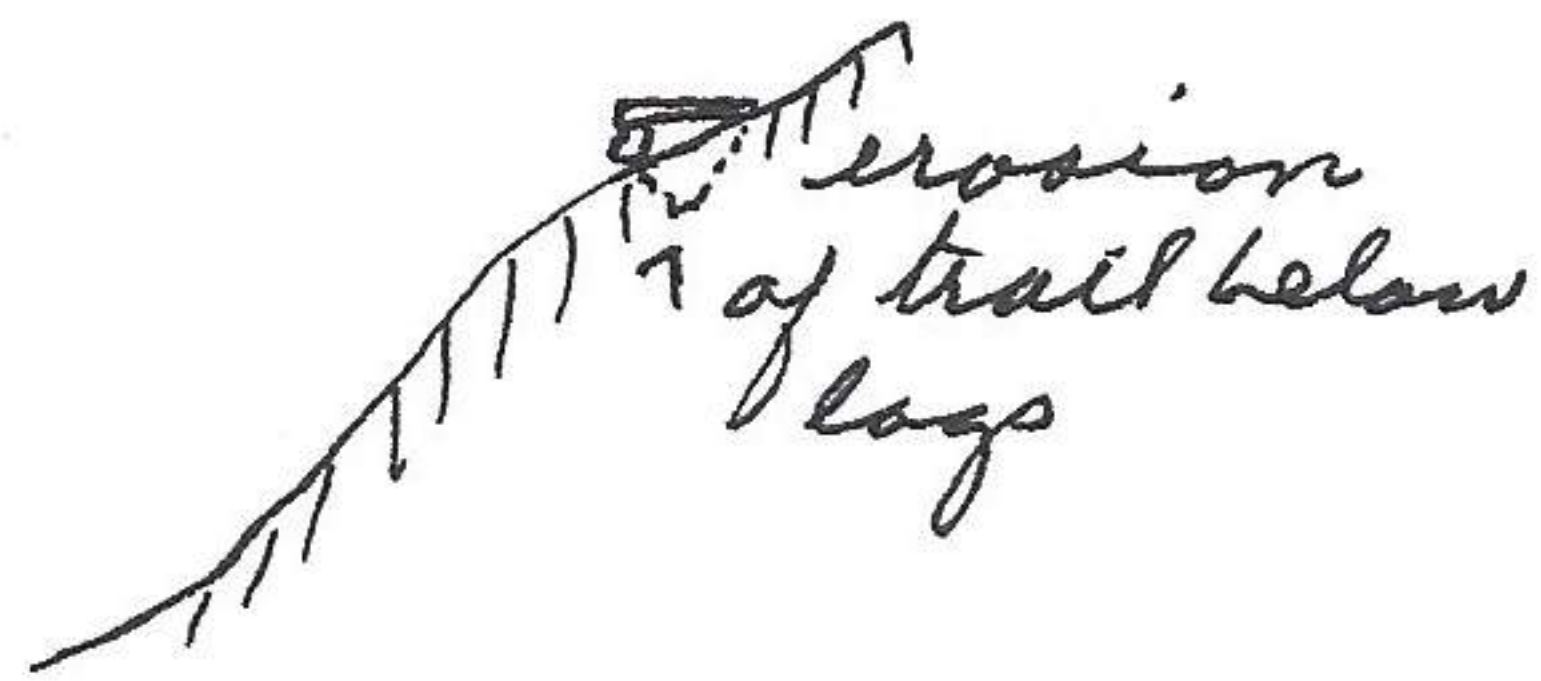
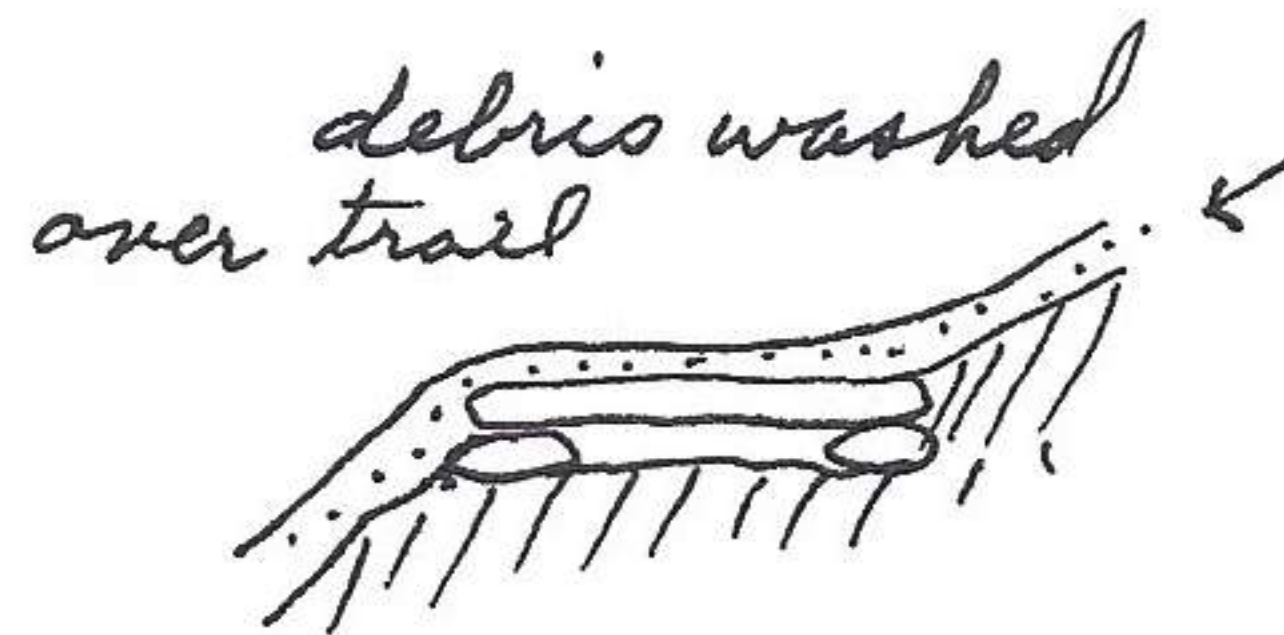

10:43 temp 58°F. This morning followed old logging trail up slope from right of Chatterbox Falls. This corduroy trail was used to slide logs down the steep graded course.

where trail crossed solid rock the corduroy logs were not used.

trees eroded on edges facing trail

current trail where logs have been eroded away.

This trail was followed for approx 3/10 mi where foot trail leaves corduroy trail. Trail upto that point alternately followed in erosion trail, on corduroy log or by the edge of the corduroy logs. No mammals or birds observed on trail.

7:00 P.M. Photo 900616-1 Chatterbox Falls. which is Loguilis Creek at point where it enters Princess Louisa Inlet. This same creek has falls along its course above. The grass and sedge wetlands below are being trampled by man. During the warmer part of the day the water covers the left hand side of the brink of the falls. Photo 900616-2 ibid. but some falls showing on granite walls beyond. Oysters grow on the rocks in the middle foreground. Steller's jay flew across the delta in the foreground.

June 17, 1990

at 7:20 A.M. temp. 54°F. An immature bald eagle flew across valley from E to W. Left 7:25 A.M. Oysters on rocks and cliffs of intertidal zone on NW side of Princess Louisa Inlet in upper end are approx 100 per 20' of shoreline. ♀ Common merganser. Photo 900617-1 of Chatterbox Falls, the 'Bee' Grand Banks and waterfalls on Canyon wall. The one from <sup>top</sup> ridge in center of photo is the 545' falls.
