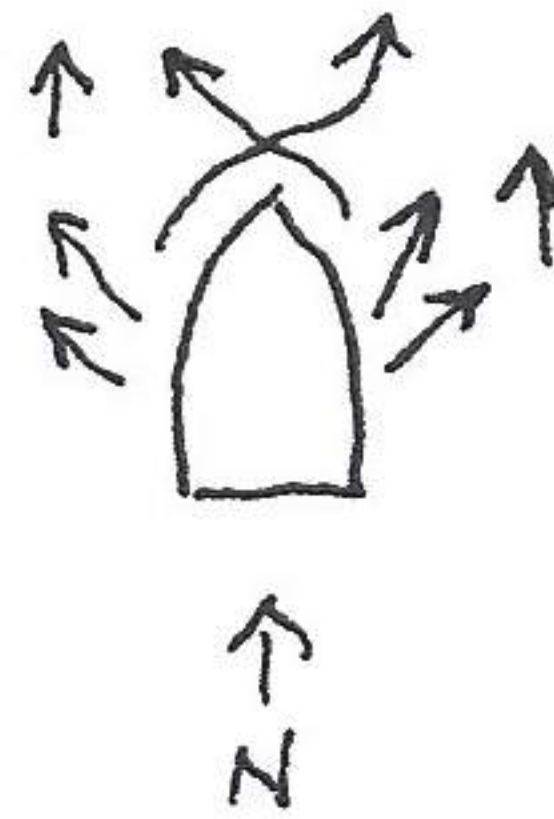


Knudsen Cove, <sup>Clover Pass</sup> Behm Canal, British Columbia, Canada

July 4, 1990

Left Knudsen Cove 8:00 A.M., at 2849.1 hrs on meter. Three to five bald eagles attracted to boat by fish cleaning. Wind mild. Local overcast. 8:25 A.M. At least 18 Dall porpoises swam along with boat for 7 minutes

The most characteristic behavior is the speed. Our boat was moving approx 8 knots whereas the porpoise



at times moved at least twice that speed. The surfaced at most any place, especially on bow waves where considerable plumes of water trailed their surfacing.

9:05 A.M. Caamaño Point on S end Cleveland Peninsula. no birds observed across the Behm Canal. 8 surf scoters flew north over boat. 9:34 A.M. first glaucous-winged gull. 9:41 A.M. second glaucous-winged gull. Old bald eagle nest first point S of Neblacker RW marker. A Cove at north end. 9:55 A.M. at R and W marker at Neblacker Point. Mountain to NE is 3095 elev. All forest except irregular outlined green of alpine on top. Avalanche tracks in forest below alpine. 9:59 A.M. 2 bald<sup>ad</sup> eagles in tree. Another one in air above. 10:00 A.M. Can now see Ship Rock Island. 10:07 A.M. Prominent Point. 10:17 A.M. 13 Dall porpoises swimming along side and in front of boat. Boat travelling 16000 R.P.M. They remained in area for 3 minutes. 11:00 opposite a rock island. 11:16 A.M. 8 porpoises (Dall) came toward boat when first observed approx. 150' away. They were approx 50 starboard and instead of coming to boat they passed to stern and continued in that direction. These porpoise were opposite a mountain to E at 2485 elevation. 11:28 new boat speed 11000 RPM. 11:45 W of Lee Rocks. Arrived Meyer's Chuck 12:30 P.M. 3 hrs and 25 min this morning. This evening took several photos of area. Photo 900704-1 of cove and boats. The Bee last one on right of docks and by larger fishing boat. Photo to W. These docks are supplied by state and serve more as refugia during heavy weather. State docks near larger cities or center of fishing are generally 100% preoccupied by fishing vessels. except when seasons permit fishing. In most marinas whether operated by local communities or otherwise, lease at least 90% of available space to local and provide only 10% as transient use. Most boats passing thru use stalls of people who are at the moment not using them. They pay regular fees plus \$3.00 per month right for electricity which is passed on to the leasing
