July 12, 1990

at marina (inside protected) noted a pigeon guillemot with a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4" marine worm in bill. worm sp.? but like *Nereis virellosa* (sand worm) or *Amphiporus bimaculatus* (thick Amphiporus). It held in mouth for 4 minutes, then flew 120' and consumed it.

July 13, 1990

Left Wrangell at hr. meter 2868 at 8:34 A.M. Clear. 2 mew gulls at exit of harbor. 8:40 A.M. raft of debris, mainly rockweed. 2 mew gulls feeding at raft. 9:09 A.M. 5 mi. Island to port. Adult bald eagle at north end. 9:25 A.M. Another raft of debris, length indeterminate and with approx. 120 ft. 9:34 A.M. pigeon guillemot, American crow. 9:39 A.M. Adult bald eagle flying across channel. American crow (2). 9:42 A.M. 2 pigeon guillemot, American crow. 9:47 A.M. Two Tree Island. From here the various islands appear in profile. Low Point.




Level Island

Alexander, now n. 11:21 A.M. old mud slides now grown to deciduous trees and contrasting in greens. 11:26 midway Rock. 11:34 A.M. December Point. 11:38 A.M. Pt. Lockwood and beacon no. 1. 11:42 A.M. marbled murrelet and Bonaparte gull. 11:48 marker no. 4. 12:25 A.M. green marker 29. 3 marbled murrelets. 12:34 marker 42. Private dock beyond. 3 bald eagles on rocks on beach and 2 in trees. 12:41 P.M. bald eagle on rock at marker 48. 12:44 2 bald eagles on flats. 12:47 P.M. Adult bald eagle. 12:49 P.M. marker no. 50. 1:07 P.M. mountain Point. at marker 51. 6 mew gulls as we approached Seaw. Bay. 1:33 marine marker 52. adult bald eagle. 1:56 P.M. at marker 54, 42 Bonaparte gulls, 11 glaucous-winged gulls. 2:10 P.M. Petersburg. Petersburg is a "Little Norway" only as one looks east across Fredrick Sound toward the snow covered mts of the Stikine River and glaciers. LeConte Glacier although we did not visit it, is accessible and of exceptional scenic value. The streets of Petersburg are wide, clean & the city is organized.
