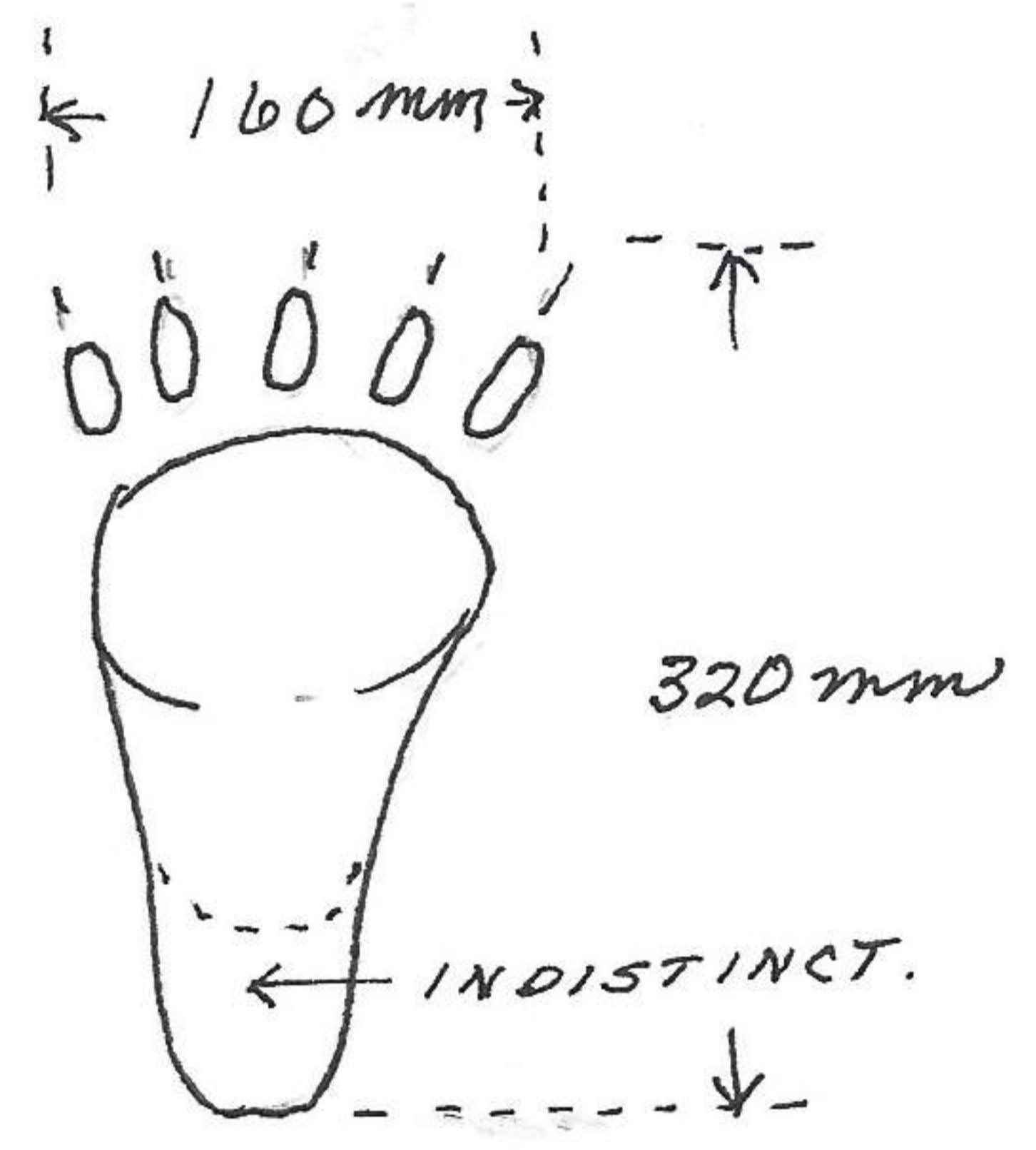
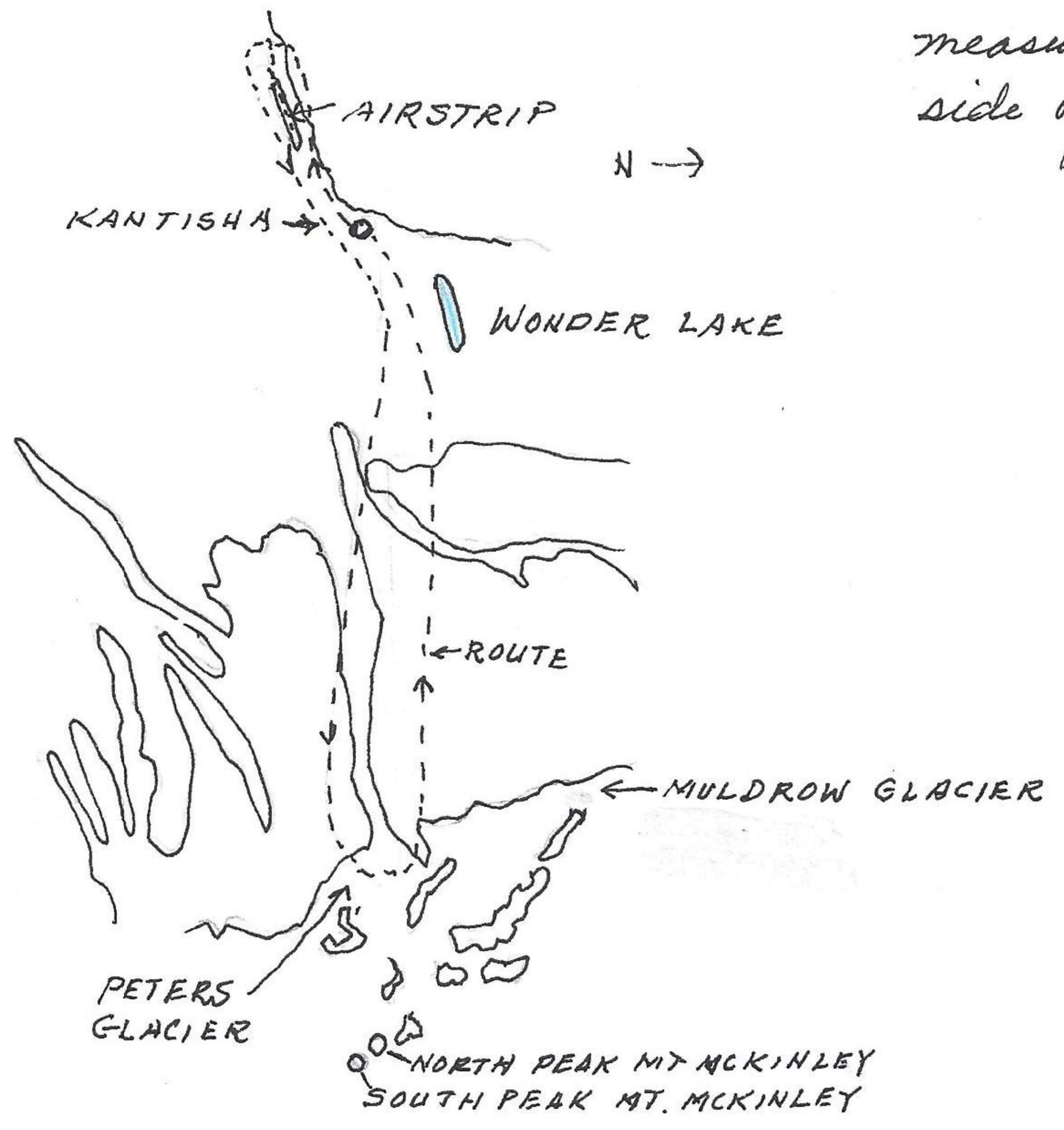

Sept 8, 1990

Made plane trip with Mickey Maher from 12:00 P.M. to 12:30 P.M. to Peters Glacier and return. At airstrip measured black bear imprint along side of runway, S side, 1/2 way down.



5 sets of moose tracks were also observed in same area.

Mary B Jensen & James R also had same trip later. On our flight at about half way down the runway the lodge pet dog of many years ran out to intercept the departing plane and was struck by the right tire. Mickey attempted to pull away and although the speed was pre-air and the dial registered stall, the pilot decrease the dog plane contact. The rear wheel thumped on the runway as the plane was forced to make an abrupt upward movement.

From the air strip walk down moose Creek some half mile from the cabin at E end of strip. In river bottoms were thick shrubs and small trees and trails of moose. Approx 1/10 mi gained an elevated river valley floor of mainly knee deer tundra growth. 4 or 5 unused caribou main trails paralleled the brink of the benchland. Some parts of the trails were hip deep, most knee deep and vegetated on the floor of the trail as if they had not been used for many years. At S end benchland descends to river floor. Lake inhabited by beaver, (dams and houses, for the next 1/10 mile. Intercept road and continued
