

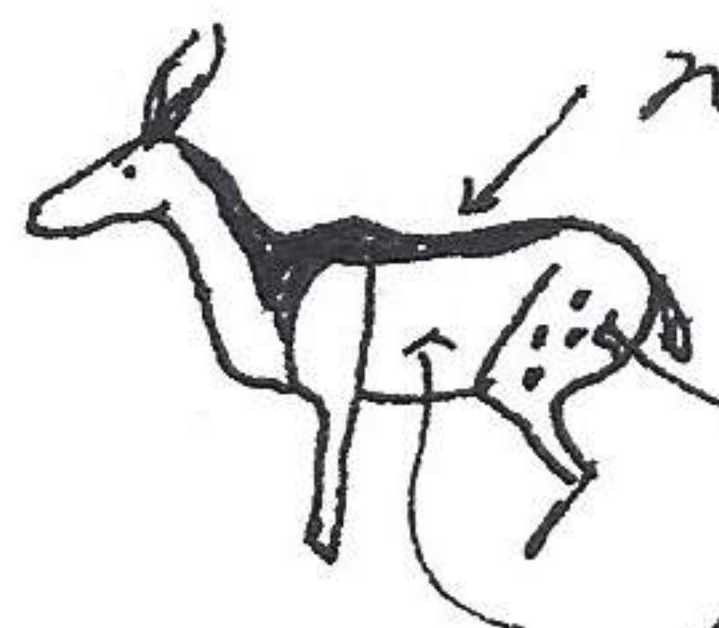
Bee Estate, Humphrey Head, Lopez Island, San Juan Co., Washington,

Sept. 13, 1990

An orange-crowned warbler flew into to a window of Bee House. It measured: 120mm T.L.; 58mm, wing; 45, tail; 185, wing spread; 10mm, bill (exposed culmen); 10gms wt.

Only young eastern gray squirrel this summer at Bee House. Takes 1/2 hr. to walk from Bee House to Shoal Bay marina via woods trail.

Smallest mule deer, a fawn of this year 2 1/2" high at shoulder. new dark gray winter pelage.



summer pelage and faint spots.



summer pelage, spots absent because of wear + sunlight.

and pelage shaggy.

5:45 P.M. American crow and band tailed pigeon feed <sup>3" apart</sup> on feeder.

Sept. 16, 1990

28 harbor seal on Leo Reef. (Rocks 2-6), 5 on Little Flower Rock and 36 on north Flower Rocks, total 69. 10:30 AM.

The symmetrical spiked mule deer  is dominant over the non-symmetrical 

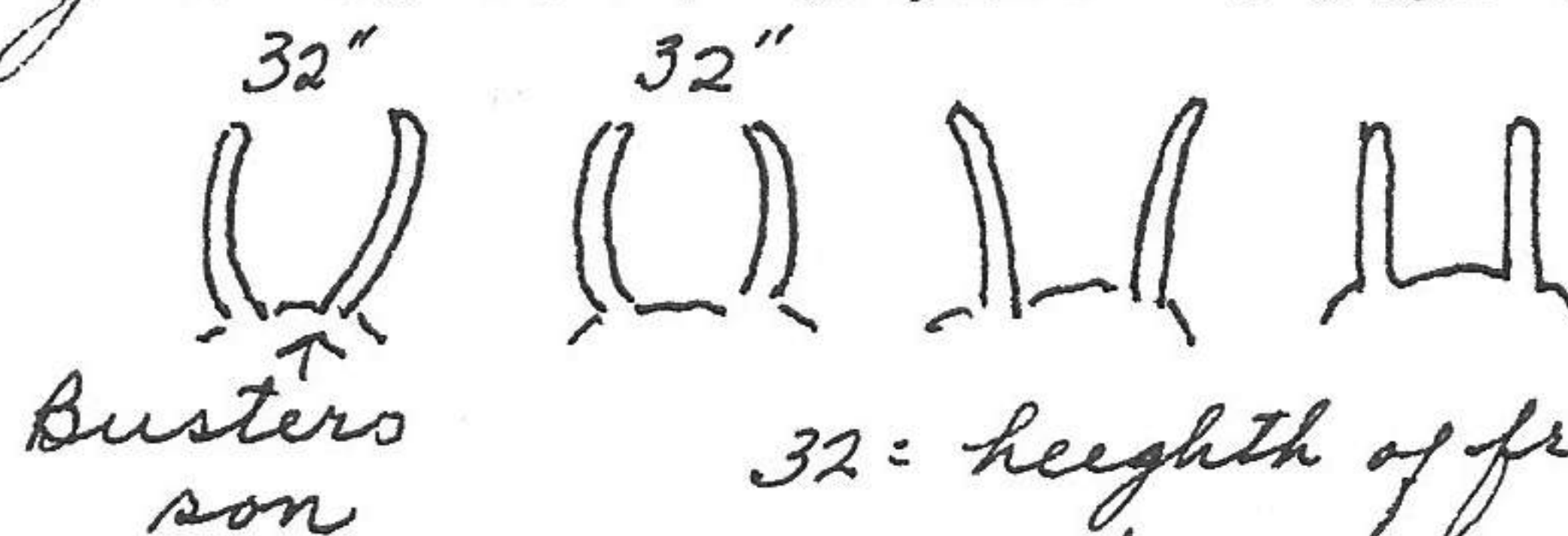
Sept. 17, 1990

2:10 P.M. a sharp-shinned hawk past Bee House 1 1/2' above feeder. Last night perfect star reflection from water.

Sept. 18, 1990

2:25 P.M. a sharp-shinned hawk flew into window of Bee House and was dozzed below window for 3 minutes then flew into madrona. The sound was greater than small bird impacts.
