

Oct 20, 1990

At Chris' home on Lost Lake in Snohomish Co., noted a Douglas squirrel, Tamiasciurus douglasi. It fed in a big-leaf maple by running out to outer limb of tree, picking off a bud and then running back to center of tree to consume it. It repeated the feeding activity approx. every 8-10 seconds.

Collected big-leaf maple leaf that measured 21" total length, petiole 9", and width (greatest) 18". a leaf of black cottonwood measured 14" total length, petiole 3" and width 8". One exceptionally ^{leaf of big-leaf maple} long petiole of the leaf measured: 26" total length, greatest width 16" and petiole 16".

Left Chris' and drove to Anacortes. On ferry to Lopez Island observed the following. Left 4:03 P.M. (in recording census or other observations a name like Bonaparte gull = 1 gull, 1 Bonaparte gull means 1 gull. Bonaparte gulls = more than 1 gull. Sometimes numbers are associated with singular names as 82 Bonaparte gull) The following, as in all cases, are recorded in chronological order of observation. For use of computer purpose the name is fully written. Double-crested cormorant, 4 glaucous-winged gulls, mew gull, 2 Bonaparte gulls, common loon, 2 double-crested cormorant, glaucous-winged gull, 4:13 P.M. beacon SW Cypress island. Bonaparte gull, 3 pelagic gulls, 2 double-crested cormorant, pelagic cormorant, 2 double-crested cormorant, pigeon guillemot, double-crested cormorant, 4:23 P.M. 200' S of Armitage Island and first time in 5 years that the ferry has cruised so close to the Cypress beacon, Armitage Island & S end Blakely Island. Mew gull. 4:25 P.M. beacon SW Blakely Island at 150' from shore. 4:47 P.M. 26 double-crested cormorant, 5 glaucous-winged gulls and 8 common mergansers in one close group. 4:48 P.M. S end Willow Island, glaucous-winged gull, pelagic cormorant, glaucous-winged gull, pelagic cormorant, pelagic cormorant, 2 separate glaucous-winged gulls, 3 pelagic cormorant. Arrived Lopez Island ferry terminal. At Bee House, observed 1 spike and 2 point ♂ mule deer
