

Adult bald eagle 2' from nest (same level) NE Frost Island, after sunset at exit of Fishermans Bay Channel 12 western grebes swim by toward San Juan Channel. One harbor seal swim in same direction.

Dec. 16, 1990

4 bald eagle sightings this A.M. from daybreak to 9:00 A.M.

Dec. 17, 1990

In front Bee House, 2 adult bald eagles flew S at 60' above water and out 30' from shore at early dawn.

8:30 A.M. 2 common mergansers and 2 hooded mergansers 150' E Bee House.

11:00 A.M. To Lopez Village. At Humphrey Lagoon 2 bufflehead. At Swift Lagoon, 14 mallards, 2 buffleheads. At pond SE junction Port Stanley and Cross Rds, 4 Canada geese, 2 American widgeon, 2 bufflehead ducks. W side causeway SW end Fishermans Bay, 2 golden plover. On E side causeway, 12 surf scoters, 16 bufflehead ducks, 2 great blue herons, 2 American widgeons. At lagoon N end Fishermans Bay, 32 American widgeon, 6 green-winged teal, 11 mallards, 2 buffleheads. At field S Highschool, an adult bald eagle soared above and buffeted by strong wind. Returned to Bee House. SE Bee House between there and Leo Reef, 13 arctic loon, 2 common mergansers, 2 common murre, 3 mew gulls, 2 W grebes, 1 horned grebe, 9 pelagic cormorant, 20 buffleheads.

Dec. 18, 1990

Started to snow on Humphrey Head at 10:10 A.M. & ended with $\frac{3}{4}$ " deposit at 12:00 P.M. followed later by high wind with waves 14 per second and 4'-5' high. Checked birds as follows: Hummel Lake 8 American Coot. W side causeway SW end Fishermans Bay (high tide) only 2 bufflehead ducks. In Lagoon on E side of causeway, 8 mallards, 1 great blue heron, 13 buffleheads, 11 surf scoters. At N end Fisherman Bay in lagoon, 3 buffleheads. Pond SE junction Port Stanley and Cross roads, 9 Canada geese, 2 buffleheads. In Swift Bay 8 mallards, 4 buffleheads. At Humphrey Lagoon, 2 buffleheads.

Dec 19, 1990

Storm interrupted electricity in Bee House and elsewhere last night this A.M. outside temp 15°F , inside 40°F . This is result of winter north-easterly storm that builds up E of Cascades and overflows down Frozier River in Canada and out into the San Juan Islands. Took several photos from
