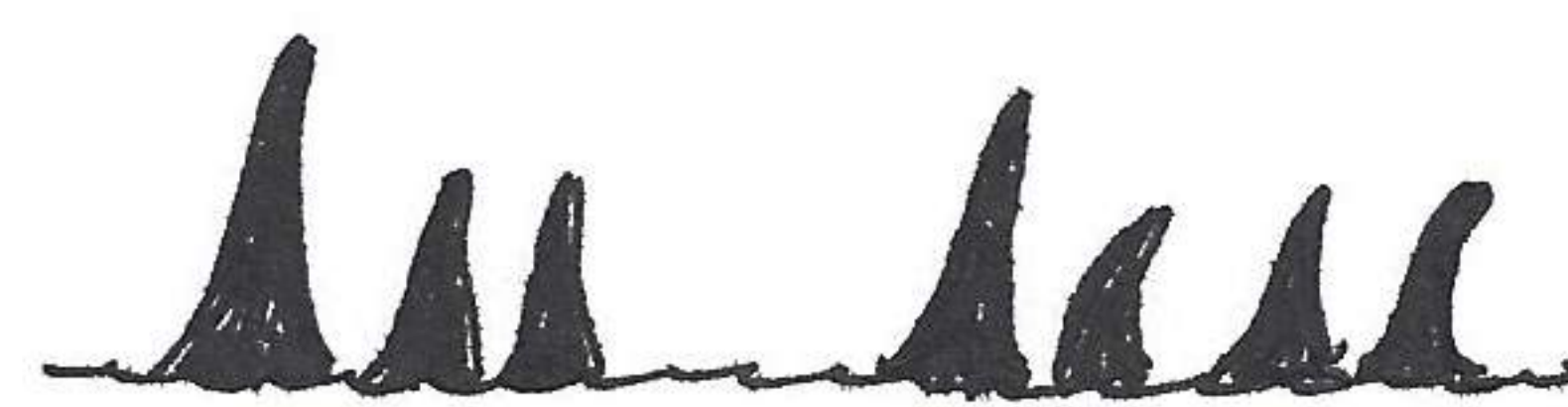

At E end Thatcher Pass the ferry slowed down to a near halt for approx 5 minutes to let 7 Orca cross ferry route on their passage to the south.

The Orca maintain regular speed and were last observed approach-

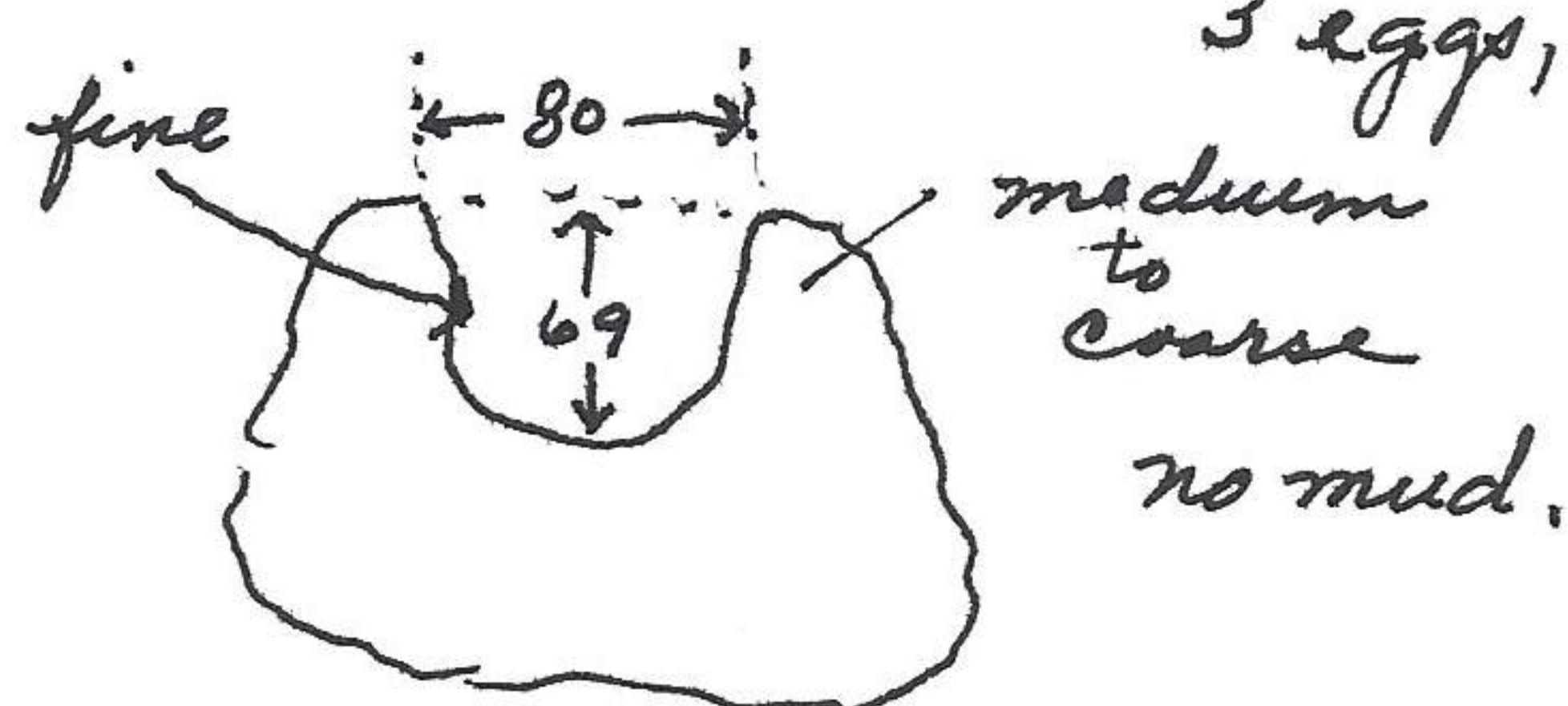
ing James Island but could not tell if they moved S along the E or W side of the island. Dr Theodore Phillips on the boat at the time and has commuted <sup>daily</sup> between Lopez <sup>Island</sup> and Anacortes for the last four years and has only observed 3 Orca and these N of James Island and travelling in the same directions as those observed today. Dr. Phillips also said that last year 9 Orca moved from E side Jones Island to Deer Harbor and out again to Jones Island. They divided into 5 and 4 as they passed around his sail boat.
