least the persistance of a mount sheep. Arrived at first open and cleared lateral ridge that offered possibilities of a beautiful descent. Being rather late in the after noon, deemed it advisable to depart from the ridge at this point rather than following out our original planned course. Can readily see that the ridge beyond is very accessible from this point and very alluring as the picture will indicate. This ridge trip is

one of the very few ridges that allows one to invade and enjoy its pleasures without the accompaning dangers that are associated with com so many other ridge trails. The proper proceedure on a subsequent



trip would be to camp in the last fir stand below and be ready for and early ascent the foldowing morning. Before the final descent (4-1-28-39) recorded two areas significant from the geological angle. One is taken from the ridge and includes lower Jennings, Pole Heaven which ends abruptly against the east ridge of left forkof Hottlee and a background of successively rolling hills behond.
