yeare of the Employ acct. Sales of which shall send you of the
La fine Gally who came from Barbary & loads home, by whom
shall confirm this & add what further occurs —
Our M^r D. is sensible of the great piece of service you did
him in recovering the Debt of M^r Leake, for which he gives
you many thanks, and shall ever hold himself obliged
to you for the same — We remaine with due respects

S^r Since writing the ^{above} we have
concluded to send 10 p^{ts} of Brandy
in the La fine Gally Cap^t John Rogers
with all of 8 guns & 12 men who may
saile in a weeks time, for what we desire
is that in case M^r Bolton should be out of Towne
that you then as soon as this comes to hand
insure for us £200, on his, the reason why
we write in this nature is because the
other will saile ere soone, that we are
affraid, the time it will spend to have
M^r Boltons order out of the Country if
should be there, will be too longe, we crave
the favour of you to doe it for us, & advise
M^r Bolton the same. We remaine yours
