from Ireland w^{ch} new provisions would get off w^{ch} the country being bare at
present this day sales a portuguee ship belonging to this Island for Brazil
and a small vessel for St Michaels w^{ch} returns we care

Wheat at Terceira at 7⁰⁰ 200 lbs & 1/2
at St Michaels at 6⁰⁰ 200 lbs

Madira y^e 26th January 1706

Gentlemen

We confirm the few lines above
since w^{ch} have not bin favored wth any from your good selves tho' how
had the arcan Gally Capt. Hinde w^{ch} a loadings of Corn from Plymouth
who proceeds to Jamaica, the Corn trade is more over done y^e
yeare then it was the last, a great Deale will be lost we believe
before the market can be able to take it off, we heare there is
more expected from England as well as from other parts, we wonder
at our friends expecting more wth we have wrote them to expect
to the contrary, advising y^e w^{ch} was already in the Country
we have had a bout 1000 m^l Imported since the first of this
month, —

We have begun to taste our new wines & find they prove good
& have begun to ship them off, but the Price is not yett broake
Suppose they will be sold at a bout 20 lb. Price their are but
few old wines left the vessels y^e are here will goe nigh to sweep
the Country cleare of them, since our last has bin dispatcht
a Ketch for Coruaio, a sloop w^{ch} 40 p^l wine for B^{rs} another
for Antigua & we have now in the Road of our Gally loads —
300 p^l wine for Lam^a a New England Brig^g w^{ch} 100 p^l for ditto —
The unity Gally Capt. Selver via Ireland w^{ch} puts ashore some
Provisions & takes in 50 p^l wine for St Christophers, the antony
Gally Capt. Munke from Pennsylvania bound for Monseratt, a brig^g
of a west Country Barke for B^{rs}, a ship from New York w^{ch}
Haver & Home w^{ch} returns, and the Dutch ship w^{ch} makes y^e —
Convyance bound to amp^l w^{ch} Succatt, but intends to touch
in England, Tray doe us the favor to lend us some wooden Hoopes
in some of the vessels you have that may come here that
can crate Boxes

for have none left to him Nor none to be had in the
Country we desire you on now act to lend us any Love
