 w.^{ch} wee hope by this time may have had your orders to accept off that when
 our Bills appear they may not meet with any demurr nor have wee any
 reason to doubt off your accustomed care of us on w.^{ch} wee totally relye for
 new wines begins to bee fine our natives give them a good character as yett wee
 have not tasted any not being fitt when they come to bee racked shall then
 give you our opinion of them wee have noe fresh provisions left on the Island
 a charge would come in good time little foreigne come left soe that begins
 to advance there are several vessels gone to S^t. Michaels to load back w.^{ch}
 wheate wee compute they wil bring upwards of 600 majois noe vessel gone to
 Barbados since the Flotte soe that vines are now must begin to bee in demand
 there this wee designe you by the venetian mentioned in Coppy who is now
 loaded and going we shall confirme this in a few days by off publick
 occasion and add what further may occur in the interim wee salute you
 and remaine —

 land y^r year w.^{ch} Cargo is neare spent already Wheate
 is now selling by retail at 30^{rs} of Sale. and looks still rising
 We have now in Port a New Gally from Boston loaded wth
 wine for B^{ts}. a small ship Galloope for Jam. a brig for
 Bermudost Galloope for Swis, We believe their wines will
 come to a good Market being the first y^t has gone since y^r flut
 vert
