We confirm the foregoing Copy of our last this is intended by a small Stoope bound for Dublin with Malvasias & Brandy — here are now in Port three Brigantines from New England one ditto from Newyork, one ditto from Virginia with Indian Corne Pease wheate & flower a sloop from Bermuda a sloop from Barbados with Beef Butter flower &c. laden back bring us noe Letter from your Brother — a ship of Bristol with 250 Mj^s of wheate from Terceira this place hath been abundantly supply'd with all sorts of Provisions soe that since wheate cannot be shipped from England as we are informed by M^r Martins Letter of the begining of December past to Mess^{rs} Miles & Richbel we are not in any expectation of it nor would it anwere what we first propos'd because of the coming of soe many vessels from ~~the~~ Westerne Colonies —
