The above is copy of our last B. the Lucy via Barbados goes via Terceira to be forwarded to Lisbon if no other conveyance can be found, we have little to write more then what we have from time to time recomended. Wh^{ch} is the remitting the £4000- to Mess^{rs} Clarke & Comp^{ts} for our Acc^{ts} and the furnishing us with 24000⁰ reas for your owne acc^{ts}, we note your order to draw on Mess^{rs} Steyney & Pointz who have likewise advised us the same, and we now write them, that we shall value on them the said Sum.

Wee have desired you to send us for our acc^{ts} Sundry goods, a List wherof we now send you, and you may likewise send us for your owne acc^{ts} Thirty ^{for} madder Black Sajs, Ten half ^{for} Boeking; the colours sorted as formerly, Twenty ^{for} of the finest Black Sajs, not of the Broad sorte, w^{ch} are generally coarse, Fifty ^{for} best Long Ells, wherof one half Deepe blew, Twelve reds, and the rest sortafte colours, Ten ^{for} of red & blew Pennistons, Ten ^{for} of black callimancoes, one half flowerd, five ^{for} Black cloth crape Ten ^{for} of fine black shalmoones, Ten ^{for} of Glen hundred bow Dyed, Ten ^{for} of cloth Serges of light fashionable colours, These goods we desire you to send us by first ship, & we shall Deduct the value out of what may be due for your acc^{ts} next year, for if you send us goods by the ship wheron you order comes to be laden, it is a Double Loss to us, because we can neither set them soe wet, nor have our payments until the next year following, whereas if they come by the month of October, or before, wee shall be capable of selling them, with out going longer time then the ordinary, this you are to consider with us, to make us the more easy.

And if you doe not find any ship bound this way, it will be better to send some ship bound to the West Indies to take in our goods, we will pay the Portcharges, here.

Therefore if you order fifty Pipes or more, we shall only further to recomend to you that they must be of the best, as we have formerly noted that they must be well Dyed, as was that M^r Wm. Parrott sent us, w^{ch} exceed yours much as can be supposed, Lett the Invoice of these goods come separate from those we send for our owne Acc^{ts} and with the Marke as in the List wee remember nothing more that is necessary, but that you speake to M^r Eyre that he order us 10620775 reas in Mess^{rs} Dupuy & Compton's hands, on whom we shall draw the said Sum for his acc^{ts} & remames.

These particulas goods on the other side, are what we have desired in former letters & if not sent before this reacheth your hands, please to send them by what we desire now together, w^{ch} we algame now mention in the List underneath
