The insect tentorium has had a long history of study, often yielding contradictory evidence. The ontogenetic contributions to the tentorium vary greatly (Snodgrass, 1960), and many theories have been proposed to account for its modifications. The history of these theories has been recently discussed by Matsuda (1965). Whatever its phylogenetic significance, the tentorium is an important structure formed by invaginations of the head capsule. Heddergott (1938) pointed out that there is a separation of the pterygote tentorium and hypopharynx in which the tentorial apophyses are volumetrically reduced and the hypopharynx is increased in volume. This does not occur in Mecoptera, where the tentorium is well developed, and the hypopharynx is ventrally displaced and greatly reduced.

1. Shortly after death-exactly how long after is not known-the body was carried to the Per-nefer, the "House of Mummification," or to the Wabet, the House of Purification." The clothing was removed and the body placed on a large wooden board.

2. The brain was extracted through the nostrils. A small chisel was used to pierce the bones of the nose, then a hooked wire was.

passed through and the cerebral matter removed. The brain could also be removed through a hole made in the skull, but this was an extremely rare variation. In no case was the brain preserved with the other organs, probably because the Egyptians did not assign to the brain any special or important func-

3. An incision was made in the abdomen, and all the contents, except the kidneys, were removed.

After the abdomen was cleansed, the diaphragm was cut and all the contents of the chest cavity, except the heart, were removed. To the Egyptians the heart, not the brain. was the seat of mind and emotion. the organ that recorded for the gods all the good and evil deeds one did during life. In religious scenes, the heart of the deceased was shown being weighed against the symbol of truth to determine whether or not the deceased was worthy of heaven.

4. After the internal organs were removed, the chest cavity and abdomen were washed with palm wine and spices.

9. Resin or resin-soaked linen was then placed in the cranial cavity, and sawdust, myrrh, or occasionally onions—carefully wrapped in small linen bags-were stuffed into the abdomen. The abdominal incision was then sewed up, often rather crudely, and in some cases a small plate of gold or a beeswax seal was placed over it.

10. The body was next rubbed with a mixture of cedar oil, cumin, wax, natron, gum, and possibly milk and wine, then dusted with

11. To restore a lifelike appearance to the face, the cheeks were padded with linen and the nose was plugged. Small pads of linen were placed in the eye sockets, and the eyelids were closed.

12. To strengthen the skin and to prevent moisture from entering the pores, a thick coating of resin was applied to the entire body.




Figure 1. Wiring diagram of a typical battery ignition sys



JOHN BULL BUYS DABOLL'S TRUMPET


■ CELADON LEEDS DABOLL (1818-1866), fifth editor of the Daboll Almanac, was the inventor of America's first truly successful foghorn. It was called variously Daboll's Fog Trumpet or Air Whistle or Life Saving Marine Signal or Fog Alarm. In the Fall of 1859, Mr. Daboll introduced his apparatus at the New London Light House, off Long Island Sound. At this location a committee from the Light House Board in Washington endorsed the invention as: 1) Having a peculiar sound which could not be mistaken for any other; 2) Directing agitation of the air to that point of the horizon in which the sound should be heard; 3) Having an excellent, easy-to-operate, caloric engine; 4) Being capable of an almost indefinite increase in the intensity of its sound.

The Fog Trumpet having been approved in this country and having brought some \$6,000 at the New London location, Celadon and his brother Nathan set off for England to establish it there. The following notes are transcribed from C. L. Daboll's diary, hand written during his crossing of the Atlantic on the Steamship Scotia (September 22-October 3, 1863), his stay in England (October 4-December 4 1863), and his voyage home (December 5-19, 1863).

8. After the dehydration process was completed, the body was removed from the natron. The temporary stuffing was taken out and, since it had come into contact with the dead man, was not discarded but set aside. The body was washed with water and palm wine and carefully dried.

9. Resin or resin-soaked linen was then placed in the cranial cavity, and sawdust, myrrh, or occasionally onions-carefully wrapped in small linen bags-were stuffed into the abdomen. The abdominal incision was then sewed up, often rather crudely, and in some cases a small plate of gold or a beeswax seal was placed over it.

10. The body was next rubbed with a mixture of cedar oil, cumin. wax, natron, gum, and possibly milk and wine, then dusted with spices.


11. To restore a lifelike appearance to the face, the cheeks were padded with linen and the nose was plugged. Small pads of linen were placed in the eve sockets, and the evelids were closed.

12. To strengthen the skin and to prevent moisture from entering the pores, a thick coating of resin was applied to the entire body.

13. Occasionally evebrows might be painted on the face or jewelry used to decorate the body. Bandaging usually began by wrapping each finger and toe separately, then each limb, and finally the body as a whole. Everything that had






