

DAIMATIAN NUTTALL

With notes on the

It is with much pleasure we are enabled to introduce a second European species of the family and with
defined genus *Nuttall*, which we believe, is more correct for the first time. It also it exceeds the common
species, and indeed all its congeners.

The *Daimatian Nuttall* is an inhabitant and one of the country from which it was first found, but also
the whole of the south-eastern portion of Europe, as far as the Black Sea, to the north of the Black Sea, it appears to
be entirely limited.

It may be observed that among all the collections of birds from India we have had a specimen of
examined, the species in question has been correctly, although the name of the family is given as
with two others totally different from the *Daimatian* to the *Common Nuttall*.

In its general appearance it is very like the *Common Nuttall*, and indeed it exhibits a striking resemblance
to the *Common Nuttall*.

At its description and the number and colour of its eggs we have been enabled to obtain very interesting
yet doubtless they differ but little from those of its immediate and well-known ally. The same is true of the
bird, together with its robust and powerful bill, and the black band on each side of the neck, which is
distinctly it from all known species.

The sexes do not differ in their plumage.
The whole of the upper surface is of a beautiful ash grey, a dark line begins at the base of the upper
mandible, passes over the eye, along the neck and back, and ends near the shoulder; the bill feathers are dusky
brown; the throat and breast white, passing into pure white on the sides and lower part of the abdomen;
all black on the tip, and brownish on the base; feet and claws

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
