At the time of writing, a specimen in the Dresden occupies a well-marked place among other allied genera by its very distinct frill round the neck. The habitat of the bird is unknown of its habits or character. The following description is given. *Male* (not quite full-grown) back much mixed with brownish violet, the quills brown. The plumage of the tail black with a purplish violet, with a tinge of bronze, with a bronzy sheen and chest metallic green. The lengthened feathers of the wing-coverts black; under wing-coverts black. Total length 12.4 inches. The figure in the Plate is from a sketch made by Meyer.
