Paryphephorus duivenbodii, Meyer.

This species is known from a single specimen from New Guinea, but the general appearance of *Paryphephorus* is well known, but it differs in having developed to any great extent. *Paryphephorus* and *Ptilinopus*.

Nothing is known of its habits. The following is the description of the adult male. General colour very iridescent black, the two central tail-feathers black, glossed with iridescent reflections; on the four outer tail-feathers, becoming blue on the tips in the upper breast, becoming blue on the sides of the neck. The length of the male is 17, wing 10.5, tail 10. The figure in the Plate is drawn by W. Hart in 1890.
