Capitulum Dentatum

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The capitulum dentatum is a small, rounded, and slightly flattened structure, which is found in the mouth of the fish. It is composed of a single piece of cartilage, and is covered with a thin layer of skin. The structure is located at the front of the mouth, and is used for biting and crushing food. It is a characteristic feature of the fish, and is found in all species of the genus.

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
