

broad one on the breast, the latter succeeded by a band of black; the wings, upper tail-coverts, and tail bluish lead-grey; back, scapulars, and sides of breast olivaceous; abdomen and under tail-coverts very bright red; tips of the longer under tail-coverts blue; primaries marked in the middle with a white spot; a white spot near the bend of the wing; bill and feet dusky.

Total length 6 inches, culmen 1·0, wing $4\frac{3}{8}$, tail $1\frac{1}{2}$, tarsus $\frac{3}{8}$.

I owe the opportunity of figuring this species to the kindness of two friends, Count Salvadori and Mr. George Dawson Rowley, both of whom lent me their specimens.
