

# GOULDIA CONVULSIFLORA

CONVOLVULACEAE

*Gouldia convulsiflora* (Gray) Johnston  
This species is found in the mountains of the Pacific coast of Mexico, from the Gulf of California to the Gulf of Tehuantepec. It is a perennial herb, with a thick, woody root. The leaves are alternate, lanceolate, and have a smooth margin. The flowers are small, tubular, and have a two-lipped corolla. The fruit is a small, round capsule.

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
