

For the third section, or Banded Araçaris, I propose to adopt Prince Charles Lucien Bonaparte's generic title of

BEAUHARNAISIUS,

WITH THE FOLLOWING CHARACTERS :—

Aspectus generalis, sicut in genere PTEROGLOSSO dicto, attamen rostro delicatule læviore, necnon alis brevioribus, et caudá attenuate minore.

General structure as in *Pteroglossus*, but the bill more delicate, the wings shorter, and the tail smaller and of a lighter form.

Unlike the members of the genus *Ramphastos*, which are universally spread over South America, and the *Pteroglossi*, which are nearly so, the members of the genus *Beauharnaisius* are almost entirely confined to the districts bordering the Amazon and its tributaries; and there is scarcely any part of the banks of this river where Palm-trees abound that one or other of the species is not to be found.
