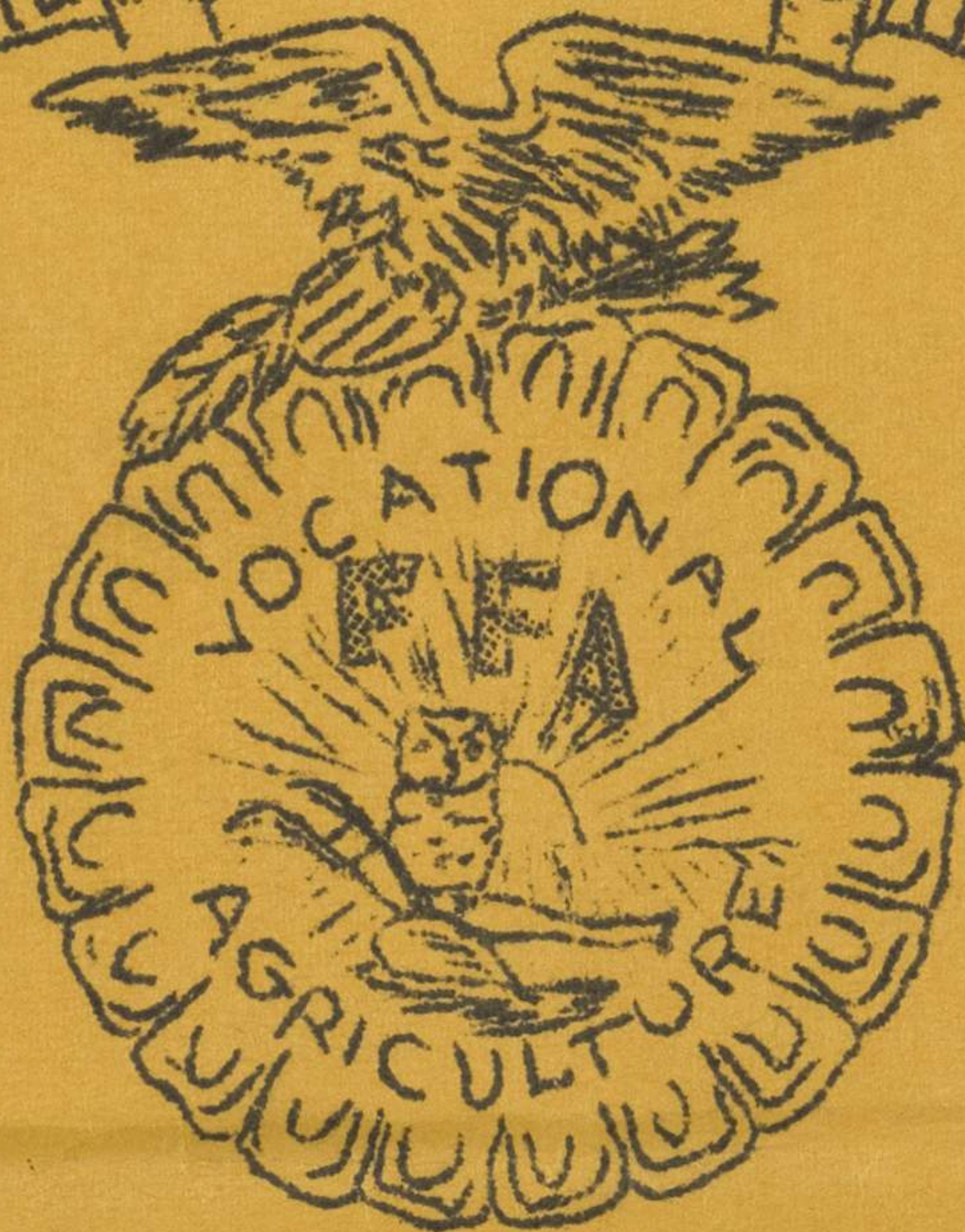

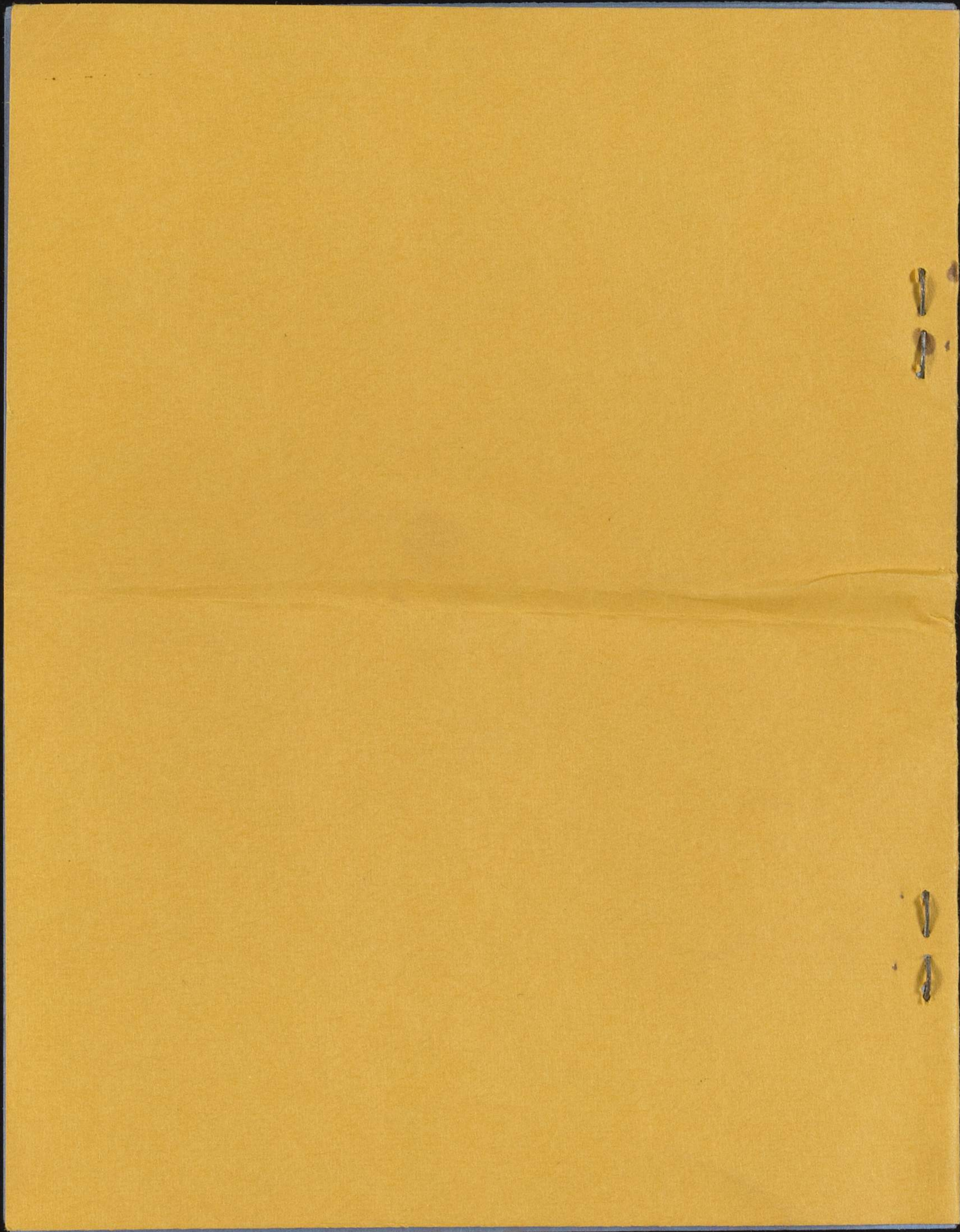

— THE STORY —

Act I

Once upon a time, in a far-off country, a stranger wandered to the Blue Mill with some grain to be ground. He became a willing listener while the miller boasted that his daughter Gretchen could spin straw into gold. The King’s men, who have been hunting in the nearby forest, overhear this wondrous tale, report it to the king, and forthwith the miller is ordered to bring his daughter to court to prove her skill.

Act II

Gretchen, at court, is put to work, but is helpless and fearful until a dwarf, Rumpelstiltskin, appears and offers his aid. In payment he bargains first for her necklace, then her ring, and spins the straw as she sleeps. The king is pleased and promises to make Gretchen his queen if she spins a third and last load of straw. With no valuables left, Gretchen readily agrees to the dwarf’s shrewd demand for her first-born child. The straw becomes gold, and Gretchen is queen.

Act III

Three years later, in the midst of preparations for christening the baby princess, the dwarf pays a secret visit to the queen and demands his reward. The queen becomes so upset that he relents a little and offers to release her from her promise if she can guess his name. With the wishing fairy’s help, she speaks the dwarf’s name, and he disappears in a rage. Happiness reigns in The Land Of Once Upon a Time.

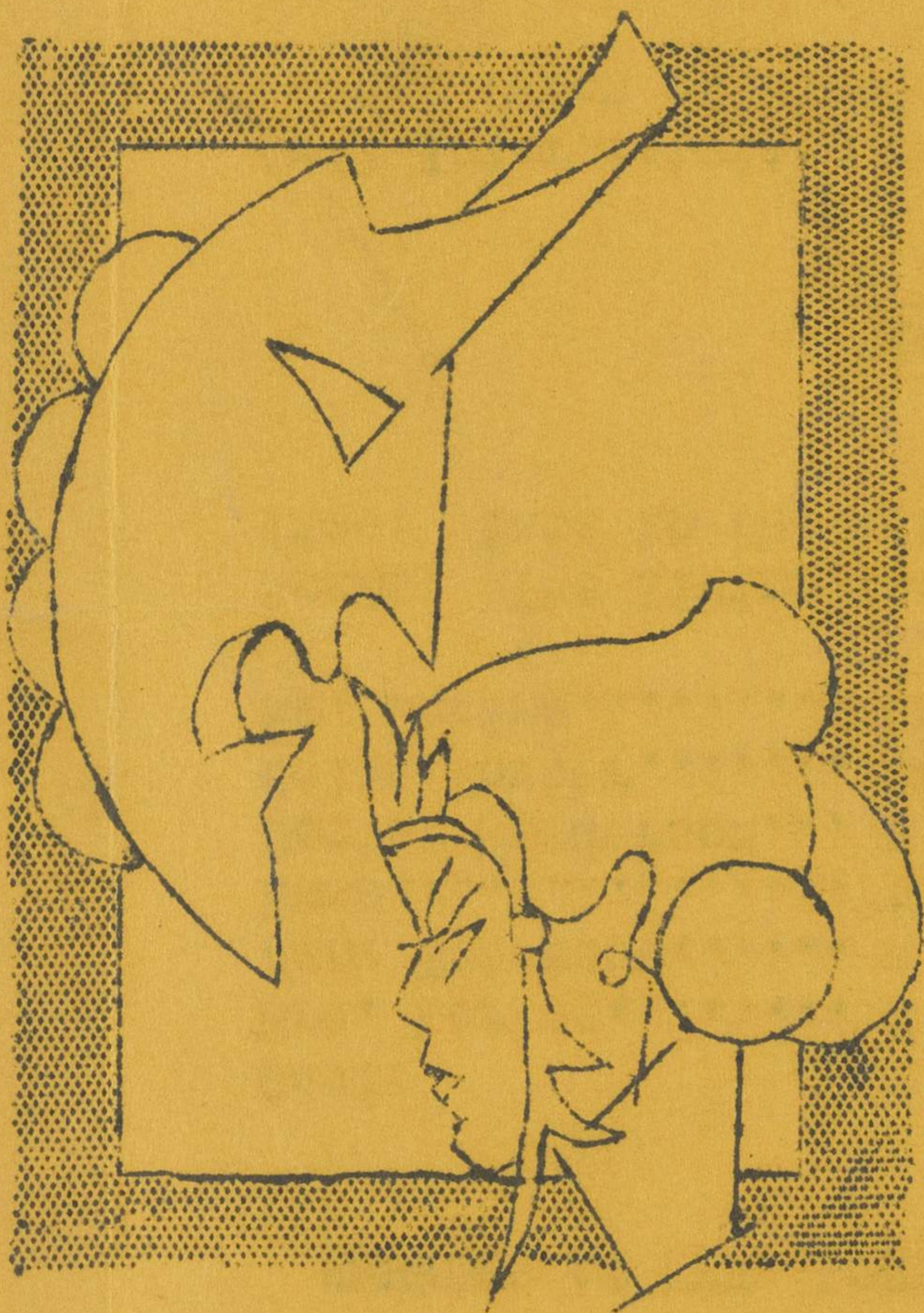
