CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

Relative to Territorial Legislation.

- 1 Resolved, That the right in Congress to govern is incidental and
- 2 necessary to the right to acquire and hold territory; that in providing
- 3 a government for a territory under this right, it should be based upon
- 4 the popular will of the lawful inhabitants of the territory, subject to
- 5 the constitution, laws, treaties and compacts of the United States; that
- 6 the admission of a territory into the union as a state, should be upon
- 7 the voluntary application of the people of the territory, with a constitu-
- 8 tion of their own choice, republican in form, and not in conflict with
- 9 any of the laws or ordinances of the general government.
- 1 Resolved, That the attempt on the part of the administration of the
- 2 general government, to force upon the territory of Kansas a constitution
- 3 that is known to be opposed by a large majority of the inhabitants, is
- 4 repugnant to the principles of self-government, is a violation of the
- 5 pledges of Congress in the act organizing the territory, and an act
- 6 traught with danger to the peace and liberty of the country.
