Dear Son

Yours of the 15" ult came to hand some days since -- in which you say that you had not heard from home since you left. I have written & hope ere this that you have Recd my letter -- it appears that your troubles are not at an end, but more complex than heretofor[e] -- but hope on & fight if your rights cannot be secured otherwise -- How did you find your affairs in Burlington & how has the money crisis affected the value of real estate -how is & has been the weather. I guess we can boast of Milder & pleasanter weather than the west. Sleighing good & to day is beautiful & warm. Much like March. I saw Mr Kinsley from Cambridge a few days since he informed me that he designed to go to Kansas next spring Also a Mr Mudgett & Chase were going. I design to start as soon as I learn that the Missouri River is navigable. I am settleing up as fast as possible but it is up hill business money with many is out of the question I Reed a line from C C Bisbee. he appears to be well pleased with his location & prospects. Old Mr Ballard died very suddenly a few days since in a fit -- Mr Bancroft & Eaton from Boston were here on Monday & wishhed to be remembered to you we design to pay our friends in Georgia a visit next week we have not heard directly from them for some time Noyes wrote me that he thinks of going to X--, with me, his health is quite poor, do you think it advisable for him to go.
