When a bill shall be returned by Action on govthe Governor to the Council, with his objections to the same, the objections shall be entered at large on the journal, and the Council shall proceed to reconsider the bill. After such reconsideration, the question shall be-Shall the bill pass, the Governor's objections to the contrary notwithstanding? If twothirds of the Council agree to pass the bill, it shall be endorsed by the President, as having passed the Council notwithstanding the objections of the Governor, and transmitted, with the Governor's objections, to the House of Representatives.

36TH. It shall be the duty of the Sergeant- Duty of Serat-Arms and his assistant, to have the docu- geant at arms. ments and bills promply placed on the files of the President and Councilmen, in the order of their numbers, and it shall be the duty of the assistant Sergeant-at-Arms to see that the mails are punctually delivered.
