Clouds & sunshine - no rain - Totman brought 2 qts sour milk for me - made a two cup loaf of corn meal & graham bread & steamed it, then browned it in the oven - Made a 1/2 receipt of Fanna's Cookies - boiled 5 potatoes & 2 eggs - Mr & Mrs Kierstead have gone to Leon & vicinity on a visit of 3 or 4 days - left the hens in my care - I am rejoiced to have them gone - it is so quiet & homelike - Got 6 little onions in garden - Mr K. said I was to get onions when I chose - Read papers & Agatha's History -

Sat 9.

Pleasant - warm - no dew - Got 7 stalks of pie plant & 25 little stems of currants - stewed them & my 1/2 doz wee onions Made biscuit with fine flour one cup sour milk scant tea spoon of soda, salt butter & a pinch of salt - Scrambled an egg - Fed the hens this morning; Jim came & fed them tonight & I fed them some more - Had a foot bath - mended my floor - Mrs G. called 2 1/2 minutes - I went down to P.W. & store; got my "Grape Belt" & 2 lemons - Am reading Clara Augusta's Pearl of the Ocean - Do not feel well physically - guess I do not eat temperately - fear milk does not agree with me - Am enjoying quiet

Sun 10

Seems very warm - Made Graham griddle cakes - opened my can of Salmon Steak that I got to Youngs a long time ago - It kept very nice - Totman brought 2 qts of milk so Talia & I had good fare - I had the whole care of the hens & chicks today - knit awhile on rug - Read Red Cow Farm by Mrs Henry Wood & began The Fatal Marriage by M. E. Braddon - Read 2 Speculations aloud - one by Steele one by Addison - Saw no one today to speak with so have been unspeakably happy
