Stewed a few hand gals of dried apple. Knit on Simple Broad lace & hooked a little - Bought a Buffalo News 1 ct & read in it this evening to Mrs. Bouguin - Read about Seals in my Wood's Natural History. I now will read a chapter in Apocrypha Mrs. K. is sick today, pretends to want to die. I dreamed I saw Ma last night - We were in Hammon-ton; wind blew a door open & she bade me shut it, & I did - I am glad that I see Ma in dreamland some times, and clear ones full

Foggy, then rain, this evening snowing - Made pork gravy for the cats & beef broth to eat with crackers for self & them - Knit & hooked as yesterday, bought a News & read it to Mrs. Bouguin this evening. The one I bought of Fred Sutton 1 ct - Read in my Wood's Natural History & 1st Maccabees in Apocrypha. Mrs. K. is not much better. Mrs. B. is suffering from rheumatism & I am nervous & kidneys are out of tune & I have put some salt in cold water to drink to see if it will do good.
