Mary Magdalene Cannon Jones, the oldest daughter of David and Anna Slaughter Cannon was born October 21, 1890 in Norton, Norton County, Kansas, and departed this life at the Graham County Hospital, Hill City, Kansas, on August 1, 1966, at the age of 75 years, 9 months, and 10 days.

She moved with her parents to Rooks County and attended elementary school at Stockton. Later she and her parents moved to Graham County and she attended school at Nicodemus.

She professed a hope in Christ in 1908 and united with the First Baptist Church of Nicodemus and was a faithful member. At the time of her passing, she was president of the First

Baptist Missionary Society. She was kind and loving to everyone. Because of her love for children she was a mother to many besides her own.

She was united in marriage to Schuyler C. Jones on December 15, 1910 and to this union 13 children were born. They farmed for a few years in Rooks County and then moved to Graham County where they continued to engage in farming. Mr. Jones passed away on June 27, 1965. After his passing she continued to live on the farm with her son, Lawrence.

She was preceded in death by her parents, husband and son.
