The Kansas Minister discussed racial discrimination at length and said that every act of racial discrimination is as harmful to this country as an agent turning over a secret weapon to a foreign power. He added that when national officials like President Eisenhower and Vice-president Nixon publicly the need for the elimination of discrimination its importance should be realized.

But Rev. Pearle said there are many hopeful signs discrimination is dying out. He pointed out that when discrimination exists, as it does in America, there are constructive steps that can be taken by the minority and majority groups.
