I don't know what would become of me if Harry were not so nice. He is now cleaning my room and trying to make me comfortable.

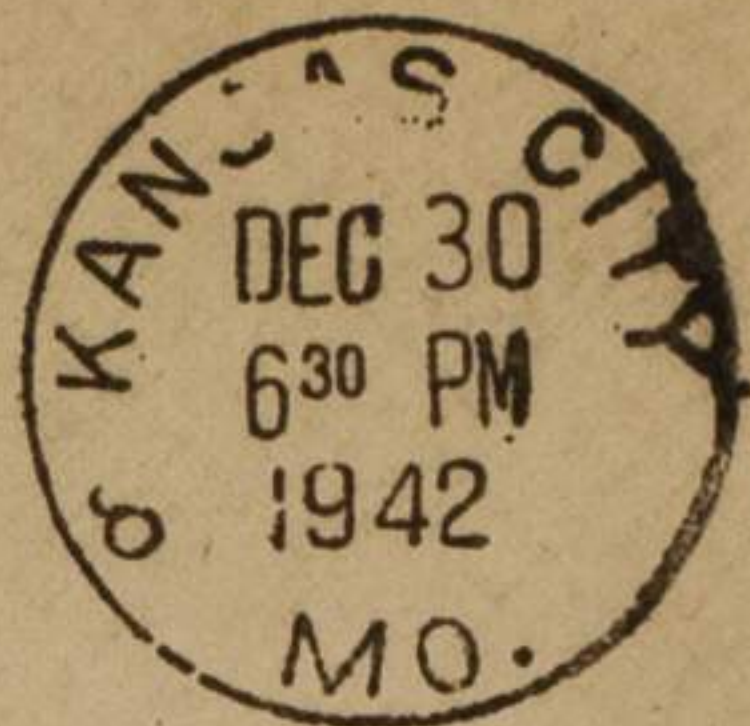
Had a plenty of Xmas dinner from the neighbours. Mrs Mansfield looks after me when Harry is out. Louise is away a good deal when Bro. is out.


