I, Marie E. White Moore, a resident of Graham County, Kansas, being of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby make, declare and publish this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills and/or codicils by me made.

I hereby request that my executor hereinafter named shall pay all my just debts and funeral expenses as soon as possible and convenient after my death.

I hereby give, devise and bequeath to my husband, Eugene Raymond Moore, a life estate in and to the Northwest Fifteen Acres (NW15A) of the Southwest Quarter (SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>) of Section 28, in Township 7, Range 21, in Graham County, Kansas, for and during his natural lifetime and upon his death, in fee simple, to my brother, Alonzo G. Alexander, II.

I hereby give, devise and bequeath to my husband, Eugene Raymond Moore, the sum of \$3,000.00 in cash, said amount to be paid within fifteen months after the date of my death. If for any reason my husband should predecease me, all devises and legacies to him shall be distributed in the residuary clause of my will hereinafter set out.

After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses and the bequests to my husband as hereinabove set out, I hereby give, devise and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder of my property that I may own or be entitled to at my death, whether it be real estate or personal property, as follows, to-wit:

1. To my sister, Bernice Bates, an undivided 1/3rd interest for her lifetime and upon her death to my brother, Alonzo G. Alexander, II, for his lifetime, and upon his death, in fee simple, to Sharon Rose Dowdell and Alonzo G. Alexander, III, in equal undivided shares.
2. To my sister, Lonnetta Williams, an undivided 1/3rd interest for her lifetime and upon her death to my brother, Alonzo G. Alexander, II, for his lifetime,
