The Kansas-based Center for Understanding the Built Environment (CUBE) presents workshops for educators, who are trained to teach students to value and preserve quality architectural sites. Workshops may be planned with a community organization or school to address particular local sites and issues. Built environment workshops are especially meaningful in communities where design, renovation or construction projects are being accomplished.

Workshops scheduled in the Greater Kansas City area provide opportunities for educators to earn graduate credit. An annual CUBE workshop at the new town of Seaside FL attracts national participation for the study of "new urbanism" and how it impacts neighborhoods. The next Seaside workshop will be November 5-6.
