



## Who's Who

Actors' Guild of Lexington, Inc. (Producer) is dedicated to producing compelling, contemporary theater for the region. Established in 1984, the company has produced over 100 plays and offers more Lexington performances than any other arts group. With the tremendous support of the community, Actors' Guild is making great strides toward its goal of becoming Lexington's only year-round fully professional adult theater company.

Elizabeth Case (Co-Properties Designer) is in her fourth year of medical school at the University of Kentucky. The Transylvania graduate has been involved in many theatrical productions and most recently designed properties for Actors' Guild's All in the Timing. Beth has been responsible for lining up local artists to display work in the lobby.

Vic Chaney (Set Designer), Actors' Guild's artistic manager, has directed several shows for the company including most recently The Search for Signs of Intelligent Life in the Universe. Last season he designed the properties and dressed the set for Spike Heels. Other design credits include his set for Actors' Guild's The Good Times are Killing Me for which he received a Smitty Award for best set design, his set for Frankie and Johnny in the Clair de Lune, and his sound co-design for Keely and Du for which received a Smitty nomination. Vic is an adjunct theater professor at the University of Kentucky where he teaches acting.

Suzanne Graham (Costume Designer) has designed costumes for several Actors' Guild productions including Fat Men in Skirts, Marvin's Room, Jeffrey, Falsettos, Assassins and All in the Timing—the latter four all receiving Smitty Award nominations and Times Square Angel which earned her the Smitty Award for best costume design. Other costume credits include Studio Players' Romance, Romance and Lexington Musical Theatre's The Gifts of the Magi and Two by Two. Suzanne is an advocate for open records in adoption.

Monique Grimm (Co-Stage Manager) is new to Lexington and Actors' Guild. She has enjoyed both acting and stage managing at the community and college theater level in her home state of Ohio. Her favorite role was Louisa in *The Fantasticks*.

Kim Guodace (Co-Stage Manager), Actors' Guild's producing manager, has stage managed for many years. she is thrilled to return to the technical side of theater, although she is not looking forward to a month of "head-set hair."
