
Going Home to Micodemus

Spotlighting an overlooked chapter in American history, Going Home to Nicodemus tells the true story of an allblack town founded in Kansas more than a century ago by former slaves. In the aftermath of the Civil War, many



freed slaves found themselves without homes or a way to make a living. One group of hearty souls, hearing of free land in Kansas, set out from Kentucky for the unknown. Their stuggles to found a town in the barren plains of the American West is a gripping narrative of determination, perseverance—and success. For today, Nicodemus, Kansas is the oldest all-black town west of the Mississippi, and each year the ties that bind the townspeople are renewed and the bravery of the first settlers remembered. Interspersed with quotes from past and present residents, this is the moving story of people who refused to give up!




convincing—argument for mounting an expedition to Mars, this will excite a whole new generation of space enthusiasts!
