The 1991 Nicodemus Emancipation Celebration
"Homecoming"

This annual event will be celebrated on July 26, 27, and 28th. Activities this year include two guest speakers, Linda Brown (Brown vs. Board of Education) and Jerry Shaw, Osage Indian and instructor at Wichita State University, Wichita, Kansas. Linda will be speaking on the importance of contributions blacks have made in history and the need to teach this history to our children. Jerry Shaw will be speaking about the Osage tribe and how they assisted the early settlers of Nicodemus.

Kansas University at Lawrence and John Mann independent documentary producer from Baltimore, Maryland will be filming a documentary on Nicodemus and it's residents. NBC and other media are expected to be on the townsite to cover this event. Over 500 people are expected to attend.

An exhibit on "The Women of Nicodemus" will be sponsored by the Nicodemus Historical society. 10 beautiful sepia tone photo enlargements will be displayed. Some photos are from the turn of the century and exemplify the spirit of these fine women.

The Osage Indian exhibit from the Kansas State Historical Society will also be on display and used in conjunction with Jerry Shaw's presentation, along with a demonstration of native American dancing and singing.

18 members of the Kansas City Bike Club will cycling off Saturday morning July 27th on a 62 mile trek from Nicodemus to Stockon, Plainville, Zurich, Palco, Demar and back to Nicodemus. This bicycle tour will be a fund raiser for the Nicodemus Historical Society.

The Historical Society will be sponsoring their 3rd annual bar-b-que. Pepsi and Coors to donate the drinks, frito-lay the chips, Logan Lockers the meat. The bar-b-que is open to the public and is free of charge. Donations accepted.

Angela Bates and Gil Alexander of the Nicodemus Group, Inc., an educational consulting firm will be sponsoring the dramatic one man show presentation on the life and times of the buffalo soliders, with a focus on Sam Garland, Gil's great grand father and famous scout of the 10th U. S. Cavalry.

The annual fashion and talent show promises to be a unique treat with talent and fashions from across the nation. The softball games, foot races, and basketball tournament highlight some of the additional activities planned.

Annual Dance - Jazz and blues from 8:00 - 10:30 and from 10:30 - 2:00 hip hop music for the children will be featured Friday and Saturday nights. Township Hall.

Saturday at the Nicodemus First Baptist Church a Music festival will be sponsored.

Sunday Church services will be held at the First Baptist Church, followed by the annual community dinner for all.

A Clean-Up bash will be held in the evening to leave Nicodemus as clean and the elderly residents free of strenuous clean-up work.

Since the June 11 Wall Street Journal article on Nicodemus, people from various media have contacted the Nicodemus Historical Society stories. We are trying to be nominated to the National Historical Sites roster. Nicodemus currently is a National Historic Landmark. A National Site Designation will allow for a government effort to preserve the physical historical buildings on the townsite.

You will have an opportunity to talk directly with them and set up other times to interview them, if you so desire. This will also give you a chance to be introduced to various members living in the community versus the people that are just visiting. This is your opportunity to ask any additional questions about the history, etc.

This is a list of most people on the townsite that do not mind being interviewed: *James and Charlesetta Bates (moved to California in 1956 retired and moved back in 1978), Alvina and Oredal Alexanders (born, reared and never left Demus), *Gil Alexander (youngest black farmer in northwest Kansas, and only one of the last my generation to stay and farm), Juanita Redd (daughter of first baby born on townsite), *Ora Switzer (oldest resident and historian), Ada Bates, Donald and Pearlana Moore, Juanita Robinson, Dorothy Herndon (retired Nicodemus school teacher), Freddie and Ivalee Switzer (born, reared and never left Demus), *Ernestine VanDuVall (famous for her bar-b-que, known all over the states from her restaurant), *Lois Alexander project director for HUD revitalization project in Demus).

o Please wear both Press and name tags. This will help to identify you when you are out in the crowd and trying to get interviews. People will be told of your presence and the ones who wished to be interviewed will be able to identify you immediately.

o Please ASK for an interview - many people who will be on the town site will not want to be interview and some are very adamant about it. Please always asked if they have roots or family in Nicodemus, there will be people who are guest and visitors only.

o The Nicodemus Historical Society, as you have been asked is requesting a monetary donation from all media covering the event. 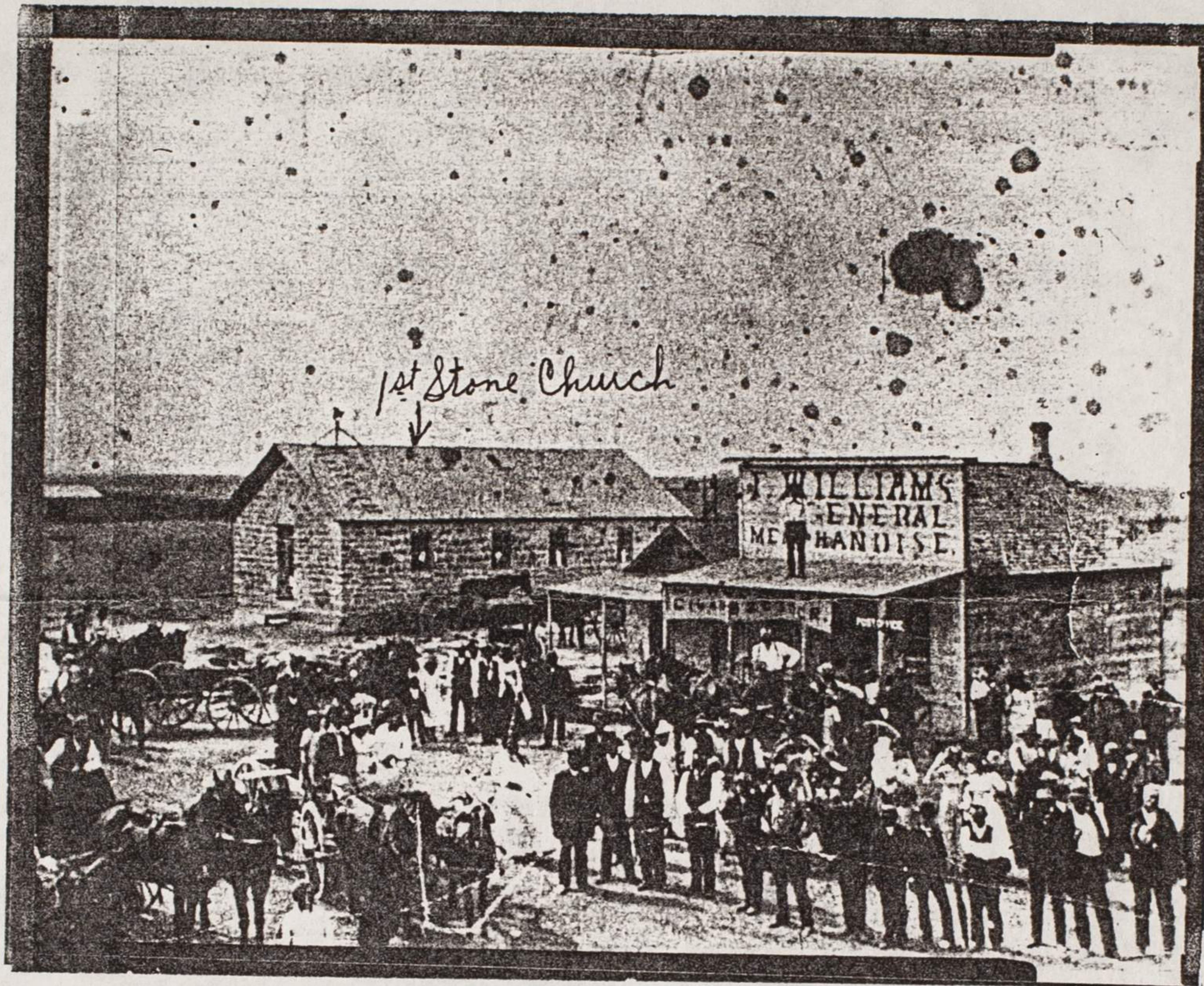

NICODEMUS, KANSAS
Established 1877

Established in 1877, Nicodemus became a center for hundreds of black homesteaders from Kentucky, Tennessee, and Mississippi. The famous Edward P. McCabe served as Nicodemus Town Company secretary for several years. With the birth of this town, it was destined to become the most prominent and historically significant all black town West of the Mississippi River. It was designated in 1976 as a National Historic Landmark.
